JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

We praise our Lord that in the Providence of God our delegates are privileged to come from the cities and rural areas in the various sections of our conference to the beautiful grove of shade trees and the pleasant surroundings of this camp site for the Thirteenth Annual Conference of the North Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The Conference convened Thursday, July 12, 1962, 9:30 A.M. at the Salvation Army Camp, "MO-KAN" in Kansas City, Missouri.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent opened the Conference and introduced Rev. Mervyn Carver who led the Conference in singing, "Since the Saviour Found Me."

Rev. Robert Keith led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg introduced Dr. William H. Neff, General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to the Conference.

Dr. Neff brought greetings from the General Church and the Board of General Superintendents. He reported to the Conference some of the results of the recent General Conference and noted particularly:

1. Rev. P. W. Thomas, elected as one of the General Superintendents.
2. The Denomination had enjoyed a sizeable increase in membership.
3. Excellent gains across the church.

Dr. Neff discussed four factors that are very important for us individually and collectively as a Conference:

1. Sound Thinking
2. Spirit of Prayer
3. Disposition of Jesus
4. Direction of the Holy Spirit

Roll call of the ministers and Lay delegates was read. All delegates were present with the exception of the following:

Motion adopted that the first seven rows of seats be designated as the conference bar.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg appointed Mr. Bill Schloeman and Mr. Bob Coulter to serve on the reception committee.

Time of sittings was designated:

Reconvene, Friday, July 13, at 9:30 A.M.

Rev. N. N. Bonner, President of Bartlesville, Oklahoma College was introduced to the Conference. Moved and adopted he be granted a seat in the conference bar.

Mrs. W. H. Neff, wife of our General Superintendent was presented to the Conference. Moved and adopted she be granted a seat in the conference bar.

Mr. Bill Fields, layman, and friend of Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, was introduced to the Conference.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg presented a fine report. He gave an account of the erection of a new church building in Mexico, Missouri and reported matters of interest concerning his labor across the district and the activities of the Conference. His report was received and accepted.

Rev. Dale Kessler gave the auditor's report. Received and accepted.

Mr. William Schloeman presented the financial report. Received and accepted.

Mrs. Arnold Keyes presented the statistical report. Received and accepted.

Rev. Arnold Keyes presented the District Sunday School report. Received and accepted.

Mrs. P. E. Brown presented the report for the Condolence Committee. This report was received and accepted.

Mrs. W. O. Bottenberg presented the District Missionary report. Received and accepted.

The sitting adjourned in prayer.

SECOND SITTING

The Conference reconvened Friday, July 13, 1962, at 9:30 A.M.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg introduced Mr. William Schloeman to the Conference and he led the Conference in singing, "The Haven of Rest" and "Tell Me the Story of Jesus."

Mr. Merlin Armel, layman from Trinity Church in Des Moines, Iowa, led the Conference in prayer.

Dr. W. H. Neff was presented as Presiding Officer. Using a practical approach, Dr. Neff discussed the subject, "What Makes A Successful Church." He suggested this was a "how to do it" discussion and spoke of features common to all churches that are making progress. He asked, "What makes a church go?" "What factors and forces make this church go and grow"? He stated a successful church is not necessarily one "activated by organization or a show of activism," or a "grouping together of Saints with similarity of views or a fellowship around things. There should be a fellowship around the Word and the Lord Jesus Christ."

He said a successful church was one that glorified God, it was a soul winning church and provided the means for spiritual growth.

Rev. Neff mentioned the following features of a successful church:

1. General welcome to visitors
2. Program of Biblical Stewardship
3. Program of visitation
4. Youth group activities
5. Training courses for laymen
6. Enthusiastic leadership
7. Bible study groups
8. Evangelism
9. New concepts and methods of service
10. A significant message

Dr. Richard Hawkins, Secretary of General Church Extension, was introduced to the Conference. He was granted a seat in the Conference bar.

Mr. Merlin Armel, layman from Trinity Church in Des Moines, was introduced to the Conference. He was granted a seat in the Conference bar.

Dr. Neff informed the conference to change the Pension fund legislation in the district minutes to conform with the action and new legislation of the past general conference.

Motion adopted to permit the District Council to take care of any incidental matters that may arise and any unfinished business of the conference.

REPORTS TO CONFERENCE

REPORT OF W. O. BOTTENBERG

District Superintendent

To our General Superintendent, Dr. William H. Neff, Our Ministers, Laymen and friends, GREETINGS in the Name of Christ the Lord. Through the tender mercies of God we are permitted to enjoy another Camp Meeting and District Conference, on these beautiful grounds. The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry, Psalms 34:15. We believe the burdens and responsibilities of the past year have enriched our lives, and have brought us closer to the Lord.

The new church in Mexico is daily drawing nearer completion. One year ago we were hindered in getting in the forms for foundation footing by much rain, but after several attempts this was accomplished, and we have been able to go forward each week. Personally it is a very interesting experience, building a new church with donated labor. Mr. William Hendren, Alan and Stanley Davidson, with their father, Mr. Hollis Davidson, furnished a great deal of labor. The Lord helped me to give approximately 1,200 hours on this project. We are now ready and have contracted the permanent roof, and the masonite siding, and these should be on in two weeks. We hope to have the church ready for dedication by September first. The cost of this fine church will be less than \$10,000.00. We were greatly slowed down on this project because of the extremely cold weather from December until April first. God has given us a fine year in Mexico, folk are looking forward to moving out of the store building and into the new church. They are looking forward to the room we will have for revivals, special meetings, and Sunday School Sessions.

We have visited each church of this conference at least two times. We appreciate the courage of our pastors. They have had battles and problems and new experiences, but God has led us safely through. Dr. Melvin Snyder, General Superintendent of this area last year, gave us two very fine conventions at Pacific Junction, Iowa, and Warrenton, Missouri. We attended a superintendents' meeting for this area, in Indianapolis, on August twenty-third, conducted by Brother Snyder. It was also our privilege to attend the church leaders' conference in the headquarters building in Indianapolis. Brother Schloeman and I attended the Central Pilgrim College board meeting at Bartlesville, Oklahoma on the fifth of February. Rev. Arnold Keyes and Rev. Dale Kessler were along in the interest of the Sunday School Convention Planning Service, for 1963. We attended the last Pilgrim General Conference which was enjoyed by all; many will answer the call before another Conference.

A fine young Minister, Rev. Ted Dodd, has joined the Pilgrim Denomination and our district, to pastor our Trinity church in Des Moines. The Trinity church is much encouraged to press on and do exploits for God.

This Camp meeting is very valuable to us as a district. It is here we have the opportunity to dig deeper, enjoy Christian fellowship, and most of all, the presence of God. May we at this time reach for a truth from the Psalmist, David:

1. Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!
2. It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down to the skirts of his garments; — For there the Lord commanded the blessing, even life forevermore.

I have received love offerings from the churches to the amount of \$74.03, from the district, \$1,800.00, from the General church \$1,200.00, and the church in Mexico \$780.00, making a total of \$3,854.03. We have received our house rent and utilities from the district.

May we look into the future with courage and faith, God will lead us on, as we trust Him and do His will.

1. We recommend that Mrs. Fannie Hilton be granted Deaconess License by this Conference.
2. We recommend that Rev. Ted Dodd be received into this Conference, and be placed in the class of the first year.
3. We recommend that Rev. Eldon Russell be advanced to the class of the third year.
4. We recommend that Rev. Mervyn Carver be retained in the class of the third year.
5. We recommend that Rev. Norma Keyes be retained in the class of the fourth year.
6. We recommend that Rev. Larry Yarrington be written a letter to see if he cares to continue as a licensed minister of the Conference.

RESOLUTIONS:

- I. Whereas transportation and distance make it difficult to promote the District Sunday School and Youth program, therefore be it Resolved that the District consist of two zones, Iowa and Missouri:
Missouri: Kansas City, Hannibal, Warrenton, St. Louis, Webster Groves, Mexico.

Iowa: Council Bluffs, Glenwood, Pacific Junction, Eddyville, Des Moines First Church, Des Moines Trinity.

Be it further resolved that the District Youth and Sunday School interests be diligently promoted on the zone and district level by having at least two zone meetings a year and one district meeting each year.

We further recommend that the Sunday School and the Youth board work together in sponsoring joint zone and district rallies.

- II. Be it resolved that the executive officers of the District Council be elected as Conference Trustees.
- III. Be it resolved that the Annual Camp and Conference be held at the Salvation Army Camp "MO-KAN" in Kansas City, Missouri.
- IV. We wish to express appreciation to Dr. William H. Neff, General Superintendent for his kind and courteous guidance as the presiding officer at this district Conference and his soul lifting messages and wise counsel during the camp meeting services.

We wish to express appreciation to Max and Barbara Hamilton who have served as Song Evangelists for the camp and children's workers, and to Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent for his dedicated labor of love and sincerity in Christian living.

We further wish to express our appreciation to the entire staff, workers, and hosts of the "MO-KAN" Salvation Army Camp.

- V. Whereas there has been some desire in the past for the merger of the North Central and the South Central Conference

Whereas economic pressures have hindered Districts of this size, therefore be it

Resolved that we recommend the Executive Committee of the General Board take into consideration the advisability of merging the North Central and South Central Districts.

We recommend that a proposal from this conference be sent to the South Central Conference to determine their interest in such a merger. We further recommend that the executive officers of the two conferences be provided an opportunity to study this matter and consider such a merger and that the District Council be given power to act for merger.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

WAYS AND MEANS

- I. Whereas there is considerable expense involved in printing the district minutes, therefore be it Resolved that each local church subscribe to the number of minutes that the church will need and that the pastor notify the district secretary during District Conference.
Be it further resolved that each church pay an amount of \$1.00 per copy and this money be forwarded by the local church treasurer to the district treasurer within 60 days of the date of District Conference.
- II. Whereas there is a considerable need to make some adjustments in district financing, therefore be it Resolved that each church be assessed \$2.00 for each assessable member per month. This \$2.00 will be pro-rated as follows:

The \$2.00 per member is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

We recommend that each church try to meet a goal of \$5.00 per member per year for our zone school.

Be it further resolved the pastors of the Conference tithe of their ministerial salary and the local church treasurer shall either by deducting it by the pastor's consent or by the pastor giving it to the local treasurer send it directly to the district treasurer each month.

We further recommend that our district treasurer send out an itemized quarterly report to each church giving an account of the District expense fund.

DISTRICT YOUTH CONFERENCE

Rev. Carver opened our Conference by leading us in the song, "He Brought Me Out." Brother Bottenberg then lead in prayer.

Dr. Neff was our presiding officer. He challenged us not to be ashamed of our religion. The Jews are not ashamed of theirs. The Catholics are not ashamed of theirs. He went on to say, "Don't be ashamed to carry your Bible." He likened that to putting up Our Flag, to let people know where we stand.

We heard a number of good reports and received them. One from our Youth President, two of the Zone Presidents reported, three of the Local Presidents reported. We appreciate what each has done.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS:

- I. Be it resolved that our Pilgrim Youth go on record of being in full support of District Conference action dividing our District in two Zones: Iowa, and Missouri.
- II. Be it resolved that in co-operation with the General Church, the Youth Executive Council encourage the Chartering of Youth Societies.
- III. Along with a growing desire to help our Youth,
Be it resolved that we have a Youth Retreat, which would start the Monday preceding Camp, continuing Tuesday and ending Tuesday night with a great youth service.
Six weeks prior to camp preregistration slips will be sent out to the Pastors. We have four weeks from then before the deadline.
- IV. Be it resolved, that the Executive Officers be empowered to conduct business between Conference. All actions are to be approved by other members of Youth Council.

STANDING RULES — CONFERENCE

STANDING RULES — CAMP MEETING

1. Whereas our Camp Meeting begins on Tuesday night, continues through Sunday: Therefore, be it resolved that our pastors come, and urge their people to attend the FULL TIME.

STANDING RULES — MEMORIAL

In order to guard against any oversight in compiling the Annual Memorials of the deceased members,

Be it resolved: that each pastor or church secretary send the names of deceased members to the Chairman of the Committee on Condolence immediately following the close of each conference year.

STANDING RULES — PENSION PLAN

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees of the Pilgrim Pension Plan has been advised by Huggins and Company of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, that the total contributions in pension plans average between 11% and 15%, while those of Pilgrim Pension Plan total only 6%, and

WHEREAS the self-employment tax of social security must be paid by the individual minister after he has signed the waiver, thus upping his investment, and it is thus recommended that the 2% membership contribution of the Pilgrim Pension Plan remain at that figure, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we recommend to the General Conference that the conference contribution be increased 1% annually until the total conference contribution is 8% and that the following schedule be followed in the program: 1962-63, 5%; 1963-64, 6%; 1964-65, 7%; and 1965-66, 8%.

Inasmuch as the pension plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with this plan.
