The Assembly voted for the 1938 Camp to be at Newkirk, Oklahoma, from July 22 to July 31.

It was moved and seconded that the Ministerial Convention, as to the time and place, be left to the District Council.

A rising vote of thanks was given to Rev. W.O. Bottenberg and Rev. E. W. Burton for their efforts, during the Camp.

The Examining Board at this time presented their recommendations to the Assembly.

At this time the Assembly adjourned with prayer by Rev. D. R. Close.

### RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that the following funds; District Superintendent, Home Missions, and Miscellaneous, all be one fund and that each church be apportioned as in the previous year, plus the Pastor's tithe.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent tithe his ministerial income from the District into the District Treasury for Home Missions.

3. Since there has been no provision made for the traveling expense of the Superintendent, other than free will offerings and since the district is so large that it will mean a lot of traveling, be it resolved that a liberal love offering be given him at each quarterly visit to our churches, same to be over and above the amounts apportioned each

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church. Be it also further resolved that he be paid a minimum of 2½ cents per mile, that the free will offering be applied on the same, and the balance paid from the Home Mission Fund.

4. Inasmuch as prayer is so important in carrying out the great commission, be it resolved that each church have a Missionary Prayer Meeting each month, and that the Pastors urge their people to pray especially for our home and foreign missionary work.

5. Since the Bible teaches us that faith without works is dead, be it resolved that in addition to our Missionary prayer meetings that each church or Sunday School take an offering each month for home missions, and also an offering for the General budget and foreign missions.

6. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the one we have, Be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5 be sent to the district treasurer, and that \$15.00 for the use of it during the district camp. Also that each Sunday school with an attendance averaging over 75 pay 20 cents per week, and the schools with an attendance under this amount 10 cents per week into the tent fund.

7. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantages of evangelistic meetings, Be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating evangelists and where it is possible and practical they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expenses.

8. Inasmuch as there are such great blessings derived from a ministerial and Christian Workers' Convention, Be it resolved that during the year we have a three-day Convention on the District. The Council shall be the Committee to set the time and place and prepare the program

9. Resolved, that our Assembly year be from June 30, to June 30.

10. Resolved that the District be divided into zones. Each zone will have the privilege of conducting spiritual zone meetings quarterly. If possible the District Superintendent will preside or appoint some one to fill his place.

The District was divided into two zones with the following churches in the North Oklahoma zone: Hopeton, Pleasant View, Sand Creek, and Newkirk. The Texas zone includes the Mayfield, Shamrock, Plainview, and Hillsboro churches.

11. Resolved, that our preachers pay their ministerial tithes into the local church treasury which shall be applied on the District Budget.

### REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

This report is from September 15, 1936 to July 1, 1937. I came to the District an entire stranger to the work and its needs. God has graciously blessed our souls during this time. We have felt His guiding hand in so many ways. The past nine and one-half months has been a time of getting acquainted with the field and its needs. We have endeavored to enter into the problems of each church and pastor and to be one with our people.

Revivals have come to our churches in a special way. Sinners have found God, believers have been sanctified, and new members have been added to our ranks. Too much cannot be said for our pastors who have labored to bring this about. I have been in their homes. I know something of the efforts put forth to bring about these revivals. Months of planning, prayer, tears, and calling have been the foundation stones upon which each revival has been laid.

Our God is still a God of revivals. Our Church must ever be taught the secrets of deep spirituality and soul burden. Our growth and development must come through an aggressive evangelistic campaign. A

socialized church will never bring about a revival in which sinners are saved and believers are sanctified.

Our membership when I came, counting the statistical reports of our established churches was 221. Our present membership based upon our present church statistical reports is 266. This represents a gain of 20 per cent in membership. Too much can not be said for our pastors who have labored in the kingdom to bring this about.

We have been successful in organizing one new church which has come into the Assembly with 18 members. This church is in a needy field. Its Sunday School has more than doubled since its organization. These good folks are looking forward to a building of their own by fall.

During our time on the Oklahoma-Texas District we have preached 180 times, made 21 visits to the churches. We have held four revivals. We have received into membership 18 and have secured 10 subscriptions to the Advocate. We have traveled 5,926 miles in District work. We have received \$104.99 from the Treasurer for traveling expenses. We have raised and turned back into the District Treasurer \$90.03 to be applied on travel expenses. We also attended two General Board meetings and two Bible School board meetings. We have received from the District on salary \$270.00 and from the General Board \$345.00.

We have enjoyed the blessing of God upon our soul. Today we are looking heavenward with a longing to advance the interest of the entire church and to get the Gospel to all people.
