MINUTES OF THE TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL CONFERENCE
OF THE OKLAHOMA & TEXAS DISTRICT

First sitting of the Conference convened at Hopeton, Okla., July 28, 1947, at 10:00 A. M. General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, presiding.

Rev. Mrs. Grace Nelson led the Conference in singing, "Happy Day," and "Covered By the Blood." J. H. Fortner led in prayer.

Rev. Sturk addressed the conference on the subject, "What Kind of a Church Should Our Church Be?" Rev. Sturk noted that we should first be a Spiritual church, second, a united church, and third, an unworldly church.

The District Secretary gave the roll call.

It was moved and seconded the first four rows of seats on the North and South, and the first five rows in the center constitute the conference bar. Carried.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time. W. P. Haltom dismissed with prayer.

Conference re-convened with Rev. J. V. Hickman leading in singing, "We Are Marching to Zion." Mrs. Harve Billbe led in prayer.

A motion prevailed that Mrs. Harve Billbe be seated as delegate from Blackwell.

A motion prevailed that Mrs. E. C. Gafford be seated as delegate from Henryetta.

The report of Rev. D. R. Close, District Superintendent was read and accepted.

The report of the Examining Board was read and accepted.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer, Rev. E. C. Gafford, was read and accepted.

A motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint a Reporter for the Conference. J. H. Fortner was appointed.

Rev. Sturk favored the Conference with a special song.

A motion prevailed that the conference ratify the action of the General Board, relative to the General Budget.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted.

A motion prevailed to recess for ten minutes.

The policy of the District Council relative to Home Missionaries was discussed.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted, as printed in reports.

Rev. E. E. Leadingham was introduced to the Conference and given an Honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

Motion prevailed we proceed with the election of officers.

After a season of prayer to God for Divine guidance in the election, led by Rev. L. W. Sturk, the election was the order of the day.

Rev. D. R. Close was elected as District Superintendent. Rev. J. H. Fortner as Assistant Superintendent.

Rev. E. C. Gafford was elected as District Treasurer.

Rev. J. F. Wilson was elected as District Secretary.

Advisory members of the Council elected were: W. P. Haltom, M. G. Nelson and E. V. League.

Rev. E. E. Leadingham spoke to the conference relative to the Pension Plan.

A motion prevailed that we adopt the Pension Plan in the churches who wish to participate.

Minutes of the Conference read by the Secretary, were accepted.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that each church be budgeted as follows:

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid 4 cents per mile travel expenses.

3. We recommend that all ministerial tithes be paid to the District Treasurer monthly, this money to be placed in the District fund.

4. We recommend that the birthday offering of the Sunday Schools be given in the interest of the Bible School.

5. We recommend that the registration fee for the camp be set as follows: \$2.00 for adults who stay the full time; \$1.00 for those who come on or after the last Thursday. Children 5 to 12 one half adult fee.

6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid a salary of \$40.00.

7. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid a salary of \$20.00.

8. We recommend that the district postage, stationery, telegrams and telephone calls be paid out of the District Budget.

9. We recommend that all general and district funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

10. We recommend that all district checks from the bank be kept on file and be turned over with the treasurer's books.

11. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$1,200 for the year.

12. We recommend that the District Home Missionary offering, which is taken the last Sunday of the camp, be applied in the interest of district Home Missions, and the distribution of all home missionary money shall be left to the District Council.

13. We recommend that we have 200 copies of the Minutes of the 1947 conference printed and that we sell them at 10c per copy.

14. We recommend that each church take up a Special Offering for the expense of the camp.

15. We recommend that this conference consider the policy of the District Council.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Standing Resolutions

1. We recommend that the fiscal year close June 30th.
2. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the close of the year, he is resolved that all district and general monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than July 10th.
3. Be it resolved that all delegates exceed the age of eighteen years.
4. Be it resolved that the Council make arrangements for a quarterly bulletin of district interests to be sent to each church.
5. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the one we have, be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5.00 be sent to the district treasurer, and that \$15.00 be paid for the use during District Camp; also that each Sunday School with an attendance of over 50 pay 20c per week and the schools with an attendance of under 50 pay 10c per week into the tent fund.
6. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantage of evangelistic meetings, be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating Evangelists and, if it is possible and practical, that they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expense.
7. Inasmuch as there is a great blessing derived from a ministerial and Christian workers convention, be it resolved that during the year we have a three day convention in the district. The council shall be the committee to set the time and prepare the program.
8. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint all committees for the next year during the present conference sitting.
9. Be it resolved that our camp begin the third Friday in July.
10. Whereas it is quite a job to get ready for camp and to clean up after the camp and as camp comes in a busy time, be it resolved that each minister come a day earlier and stay throughout the camp and a day after camp unless excused by the District Council.
11. Be it resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; providing that his or her charge be supplied satisfactorily with the local church board.
12. Resolved that the camp have children and young people services, the District Council to secure a leader for each and said meetings to be announced on the camp meeting bills.
13. Resolved that the District Council set the date for the District Conference.
14. Resolved that each active minister be released for two Sundays during the camp and Conference and that they receive regular salary or offering, providing they attend Camp and Conference.
15. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night in each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.
16. Be it resolved that the pastors be required to see that all reports are mailed to the District Superintendent by the 15th of the month following the close of the quarter, and that the annual reports be mailed to the chairman of the Statistical Committee by July 15th.
17. Be it resolved that the District Conference grant power to the District Council to act on all business matters or unfinished business occurring during the conference year.

New Resolutions

1. Be it resolved that the District be divided into zones as follows: Zone 1, Hopeton, Pleasant View and Fairview; Zone 2, Pond Creek, Blackwell, Newkirk and Enid; Zone 3, Henryetta, Oklahoma City and Bethany; Zone 4, Devine, Hillsboro and Shamrock.
2. Be it further resolved that the pastors of each zone constitute the committee to prepare the program for the rallies in their respective zones.
3. We further recommend that where practical and possible, two rallies be conducted in each zone during the year, and that all rallies shall be under the supervision of the District Superintendent.

Special Resolutions

1. Be it resolved that we, the District Conference, express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. D. R. Close, for his labors of love among us the past year by a rising vote of thanks.
2. Be it resolved that we, the District Conference, express our appreciation to Brother Sturk, for his labors among us during the camp and conference.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Oklahoma-Texas District Conference convened at Hopeton, Okla., July 28, 1947.

To God be all the glory for past blessings and future promises. This past year has been a year of spiritual blessings and material advancements.

Our churches have had revivals and there exists among our people a strong desire for the blessings and presence of God. The District, through these evangelistic efforts and the faithful work of pastors and laity, has enjoyed a good increase in membership.

The material advancement of the district has strengthened our churches and made the district a better place in which to live and labor. Brother Fortner built at the cost of \$4,900, the finest basement I have ever seen at Blackwell. This was a great step forward for the Blackwell church. Brother Gafford has improved the Henryetta church and done much to build up a nice congregation. The Devine Pilgrims have improved and beautified their church and will have, when completed, one of our nicest churches. Brother Wilson has improved and modernized the Pleasant View parsonage at a cost of approximately \$1,000.00. Sister Nelson put in a heating unit at Hopeton at a cost of about \$1,000.00. Brother Fitts finished the interior of Fairview church and he now has a very nice church.

Brother League is faced with a building problem with his growing congregation.

There lies before us a great future wrapped in the promises of God. The good offering of yesterday will make it possible to set our sights on another church. May God help us to hold and improve what we have and enter open doors before us.

We have traveled 12,524 miles in district work the past year. 5,100 miles to General Board and Bible School Board meetings. We have received \$364.03 mileage. Stationery, telegrams, etc., \$90.90. We have made 44 visits to the churches; held 21 board meetings and 11 church meetings.
