C O N F E R E N C E P R O C E E D I N G S

The Fourth Annual Conference of the Pacific Northwest District convened in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Quinaby Park, Oregon, August 3, 1943 at 1 p.m. The Conference was opened by singing the old hymn "Abide with Me" Rev. Roy Morgan led in prayer. Rev. D. R. Close, District Superintendent of the Oklahoma District was introduced by O. C. Keller, District Superintendent. Rev. Close gave the opening address and presided during the conference. This was followed by the roll call.

John Connor, A. T. Williams, and Harry Heck were introduced and accepted into the Conference. A motion was carried that the first three rows of seats were to be the conference bar. The reports of the District Superintendent and District Treasurer were then read and accepted. A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted. Rev. Floyd Morgan, Seattle Pastor, reported and accepted. Conference recessed by expiration of time and was dismissed in prayer by Dr. Dixon.

Second Sitting--Wednesday, August 4, 1 p.m.

Conference reconvened by singing "Never Alone," Sisters Smith and Schmidt led the

Conference in prayer. The following pastors reports read and accepted: William McGlasson A.T. Williams, Ezra A. Cobb, Abel H. West, John Strom. Rev. Roy Morgan, and Rev. R. W. Thompkins were introduced and given a seat in the bar. Rev. Hughes was introduced to the Conference.

The Ways and Means report was read and accepted. The Memoirs Committee, Examining Committee, and Statistical Committee, reports read and accepted. Mrs. May Heck was accepted into the Conference.

The following pastors reports were read and accepted: John Connor, Harry Heck, John Strom, S. G. Tighe, C. E. Cox, and Sherman Moore.

Rev. Close addressed the Conference in a closing message, charging us to be valiant in the battles of the coming year. Conference closed with prayer led by Bro. Close.

ORDINATION SERVICE:

Thursday afternoon, August 5, 1943, at 3 p.m. a touching, solemn ordination service was conducted under the leadership of Rev. D. R. Close. Two candidates, John Strom, and C. L. Dage were ordained to the permanent ministry. The entire congregation joined in prayers and well wishing that the ministry of these men be greatly blessed of the Lord.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Fourth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Pacific Northwest District, convened at Quinaby Park, Salem, Oregon, August 3rd, 1943:

Greetings in the name of Jesus:

In a world gone mad, in an age of chaos, bloodshed, increasing crime, and trouble; we are glad to report that God is building His church and that the gates of hell shall not prevail against it!

The Conference year of 1942-43 has been a year of many battles for us as a District. Our problems have been many. But in them all our God has given us the victory. As a District we do not have a message of discouragement but one of hope and a zeal for better things.

We have endeavored to put spiritual things first and honor God. We have enjoyed many good revivals this year under the leadership of Spirit filled men. We are at this time thanking Rev. Cobb, Rev. Harrington, Rev. Nering, and Rev. Eastman, as well as others for their labors in this field. All of our churches have made substantial gains, save one where the war work has nearly depleted the congregation. And this church is on the upgrade now. Many new people have knelt at our altars who will from this time on be part of our constituency.

We have had a 20 percent increase in membership. This in spite of having removed many names who are no longer active members of the church. We have had the same increase in the average attendance of the Sun. Schools. Our Sunday School enrollment has increased about one hundred scholars. We now have ten churches holding regular services with pastors in charge and one preaching point that, also has a regular pastor. We have purchased two church buildings and two parsonages this year.

In addition to this we have arranged to purchase these Camp meeting grounds at Quinaby Park. Money for the down payment is now in hand. The future is as bright as the promises of God. We are praying for twenty churches by 1946 which is the date of our next General Conference.

Personally I have labored my very best. I have held six revivals, one camp meeting, and two conventions. I have preached over two hundred times with 130 individual seekers. I have received \$1407.00 in cash salary this year from the General Board and revival meetings. I have traveled 10,000 miles in district interests and made 50 visits to the churches. I have conducted missionary rallies in every church with Rev. Olson and Rev. Thomas as speakers, this last year. I attended the General Board meeting in May. In addition to publishing the District bulletin, writing scores of letters, painting signs and buildings, and with Camp Meeting preparation I have found time to pray, read my Bible, and read at least one good non-fiction book a week. If God permits I plan to keep alive spiritually, mentally, and physically. To Him that saved me from the Kingdom of Darkness to the Kingdom of light, be all the glory, honor, praise, and adoration for ever more, Amen!

We plan to go forward, give more to Missions, start more churches, and claim new spiritual territory for God. Brethern, pray for us.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE
AS ACCEPTED BY THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE

Standing Resolutions

1. That the District Council serve as our Missionary Committee.
2. That each church devote one service each month to missionary interests. (Gen. Budget)
3. Be it resolved that no minister, evangelist, or Christian worker in any realm be permitted to hold special services on the District without the consent of the District Superintendent.
4. That each church appoint an individual to see that there is a food offering for the pastor at least once each month to be investigated by the Dist. Supt. during his visit at each church.
5. All money is to be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.
6. That all churches take an offering, both of food and cash for the Camp Meeting.
7. That the fiscal year shall close July 15 with pastors all taking their new charges the second Sunday after Camp Meeting.
8. We insist that each pastor conduct a class of catechism on the doctrine of Holiness each month for the education of the members and their children.
9. Inasmuch as we are living in times of extreme lusts and worldliness and that such a spirit is manifest even in holiness churches, be it resolved that we request every parent member to see to it that their children dress and conduct themselves as becometh holiness and according to our Church Manual--Page 49, Section 65, and the Bible.

Additional Resolutions

1. That we set aside a week-end period for a semi-annual Dist. Holiness Convention to be held in the zones as directed by the Dist. Superintendent.
2. That the District Supt. correspond and arrange with Bro. Wolfe as to the time of the

Christian workers and preachers convention to be held on the District this year.

3. That we give a rising vote of thanks to Bro. Keller and Bro. McClasson for their cooperation and kindness in securing the Camp Grounds, for those whose labors helped to make this camp a success.

4. Be it resolved that we give a hearty vote of thanks to sister Snider and her helpers for their labors in the dining room and kitchen.

5. Whereas Bro. Close, member of the General Board Committee of Home Missions and Church Extension, has ably and wisely directed our Conference, be it resolved that we give him a rising vote of appreciation.
