John Connor with Evelyn Ritenburgh at the piano. Rev. Floyd Morgan led in prayer. Rev. Roy Morgan, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. A. Beltz, Secretary of Home Missions, as the Conference Chairman. His opening address on "Meeting and Facing Our Problems" was inspirational and encouraging to everyone.

The District Superintendent, Roy E. Morgan, read his report which was accepted. He then read his resignation.

Rev. R. A. Beltz spoke in appreciation of Bro. Morgan's work as District Superintendent.

Carl Mansfield was appointed to take the place of Glen Abla on the Ways and Means Committee.

O. D. Weaver was appointed to take Lloyd Johnson's place on the Resolutions Committee.

A motion prevailed to adjourn until 2:00 p.m. Dismissed with prayer.

### AFTERNOON SITTING

The Conference reconvened at 2:00 p.m. by singing "Wonderful Story of Love" which was led by Carl Mansfield, followed by prayer by A. W. Holmes.

A resolution was made and carried regarding a building program for Pilgrim Park. This was to include remodeling the kitchen, work on the pump house, toilets, etc.

The report of the District Sunday School Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted.

Bro. Beltz read and explained the new policy of the General Church toward the Home Missionary Districts, including the plans for this District to become partially organized in 1950 and fully organized in 1954.

The Auditing Committee read its report which was accepted.

The District Treasurer read his report which was accepted.

The Statistician's report was read and accepted.

Moved and accepted that all yearly church and pastors' reports be in the hands of the statisticians by July 15. This motion to be placed in the standing resolutions.

Rev. Roy Morgan notified the Conference that a \$4000 loan made to the Camp Meeting for buildings was changed to an annuity. Bro. A. J. Hill of Halsey, Oregon, is the benefactor.

The Conference expressed its appreciation for this gift.

The election of officers was as follows: Council Members: Bro. Connor and Bro. Dole.

A motion was made for the secretary to cast a ballot for the present trustees. Those elected were: John Connor, Don Johnson, E. P. Dixon.

The Conference adjourned to reconvene at the call of the chair.

## EVENING SITTING

The third sitting of the conference opened by singing "Blessed Assurance" which was led by Bro. Connor with Miss Ritenburgh at the piano.

The following delegates were elected to the General Conference: John Connor, Betty L. Miller, I. G. Canary, James Dole, and Roy Morgan alternate.

The lay delegate was Mrs. Beulah Woidruff with E. W. Callar as alternate.

It was voted that the Council appoint a zone chairman.

It was recommended that Rev. and Mrs. D. E. Olson from the Nebraska District be received and retain their same rating in this District. Carried.

The Young People's Report was read and accepted.

Rev. R. A. Beltz officiated at the ordination of Bro. Carl Mansfield.

The Conference was dismissed by Rev. Beltz.

## To the Ministers and Delegates of the Pacific Northwest District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church,

### Greeting:

By the mercy and grace of God we are permitted to again have the fellowship of another annual Camp and Conference.

We are indeed grateful for the blessings of the Lord which have so signally attended the labors of His servants on this District the past year.

We appreciate the affection and fellowship of all the children of the Lord with which we have been permitted to labor on this district, and we pray God's richest blessings may continue to rest and abide upon you all, and your labors of love for Him, and His Kingdom's increase.

The past year has been one of battles, but not battles alone, but also in all these there have been blessed victories. We praise the Lord for all these.

Statistics are not always an evident token of progress in the most real and vital sense of the word, yet we have to deal with them to some extent, so here we submit to you some connected with what we have tried to do by the help and under what we trust to be the blessing of the Lord. So just take them for what they are worth and no more.

We traveled over 32,000 miles in District interest, having received \$300.00 to pay for same. We have visited all the churches on the District three or more times, preached 95 times, and some 50 seekers in the various meetings we labored in and for, held 14 Church Board meetings, 10 annual meetings, 3 District Council meetings, received 12 subscriptions to the Advocate, held one Zone Rally, conducted one District Ministerial Convention, Dedicated three places of Worship, organized three Churches with a total of 48 members received.

We have received our salary of \$100 per month by the District and the same amount by the General Home Missionary Department. Have tried to assist some of our Pastors in some of their struggling efforts to make ends meet by calling for a love offering for them, and have received a fair response in such calls. Besides salary and travel expense we received \$229.75 in cash in our work in revivals of which we held three during the year. Also we received in food donations about 30 quarts of canned fruit, juice, etc. Thus our total support for our year's work was \$2929.75 in cash for salary, offerings and traveling expense, and the 30 quarts of food donation as above.

For all this we thank the Lord, the Home Missionary Department of the General Church, and all you good people of the Pacific Northwest District. We paid for and placed in the district parsonage venetian blinds and a nice porcelain enameled sink cabinet.

God has given us one of the best Camp Meetings the District has ever had, with some over 100 seekers counting as they came. We had the best of preaching and singing, and wonderful liberality on the part of our people in meeting the expenses. For all these blessings we give God all the praise and the glory.

With the wonderful help of Bro. Story as the main helper and leader and others helping we have a nice complete tabernacle at Aurora. We thank all for their help.

Bro. Heck has built a most beautiful parsonage at Central Point, a real credit to the District. Portland with its hard working Pastor and helpers have a fine basement almost ready to dedicate for their place of worship. They have made great strides in their work the past ten months. Their report will give the full details.

The new work in Portland, Oregon City, Svenson, Aurora, and what was done at Roberts Corner the past year has been gratifying and we say, "Praise God from whom all blessings flow."

Our Churches have generally made a measure of progress and increase in the Sunday School and Church attendance. We are thankful for our good well and pump on the Camp Ground. We have tried to add some improvements to our District Parsonage. There is a great need there yet. It ought to be completed soon. Pray about this.

We were again appointed by the General Board under whom we have labored as your District Superintendent the past four years, but after much prayer and serious consideration, we feel definitely led not to accept the office as District Superintendent longer, so we are at this date leaving this office, praying the Lord who appointed Moses and Joshua to lead the children of Israel, will now raise up a real Godly and Spiritual leader to lead the District on.

We thank you all who have prayed for and been patient with us, and pray the Lord to give you greater victories in the future than ever you have yet seen or experienced.

The Statistical Committee will give you the information as to the gains or losses as may have been the case.

For all that has been accomplished, we give God the praise and the glory, and you our co-workers the credit. God bless you all. Pray for us.

### REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. Be it resolved that all birthday offerings be used for Home Missions.
2. Resolved that each church take a special offering each month to be divided equally between Home and Foreign Missions.
3. Resolved that each church treasurer be authorized to send 10 per cent of the regular church offerings to the district treasurer for district expenses, which includes the pastor's tithes. Be it further resolved that churches paying pastor's salaries use the same procedure, exempting property payments, missionary and building funds offerings.
4. Resolved that all unstationed ministers and evangelists pay 50 per cent of their ministerial tithes to the district treasurer.
5. Resolved that standing resolution No. 17 be changed to read: RESOLVED that we have a call card plan for the district which shall be for the purpose of united help of \$1.00 per call, not more than two calls per year for camp expenses and improvements.
6. Resolved that the district pay the District Superintendent \$100.00 per month, plus \$25.00 per month traveling expenses. This shall become effective when the appointed Superintendent takes up his duties.
7. Resolved that the district treasurer be instructed to pay 50 per cent of the traveling expenses of the General Secretary of Home Missions in the event he acts as Superintendent of the district, until a regular Superintendent is appointed.
8. Resolved that each church send to the district treasurer the equivalent of \$1.00 per member by May 15, 1950, for traveling expenses of delegates to the General Conference.
9. Resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$25.00 per year salary plus stationery and postage.

1. Be it resolved that no minister, evangelist or Christian worker in any realm be permitted to hold special services on the District who is not in sympathy and harmony with the doctrine and teaching of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, nor without the advice and consent of the District Superintendent.

2. Be it resolved that all money is to be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

3. Be it resolved that each church shall conduct a special Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription campaign and that a gold star recognition shall be given to each church that attains a hundred percent family membership subscription.

4. Be it resolved that our young people be given a prominent part in our District Ministerial Convention.

5. Be it resolved that each church shall furnish camp meeting equipment such as beds, bedding, furniture, dishes, utensils, etc., such that they might give away and that might be acceptable by the Camp Meeting Committee.

6. Be it resolved that each church be responsible for the salary or offering for the pastor during the Camp Meeting, and conference, and that this resolution shall be read to the church by the Church Secretary at the annual church meeting or sixty days before the Conference.

7. Be it resolved that a Young People's Rally be conducted in different zones of our district.

8. Be it resolved that we have a master plan for our Camp Meeting Grounds, and that this plan be drawn by a responsible draftsman to be approved by the District Council. Be it further resolved that all improvements and buildings be in harmony with the master plan.

9. Be it resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Board composed of nine men and that these shall include the following departments: Camp Meeting Treasurer, Camp Meeting-Secretary, Department of Purchasing, Department of Entertainment, Department of Buildings and Grounds, Registrar, Department of Kitchen, Department of Labor, and Department of Dining Room.

10. Be it resolved that there be quarterly meetings held in the Pacific Northwest District—and be it further resolved that the quarterly meeting shall be a union meeting of the churches of each zone, namely, the Northern, Central and Southern Zones.

11. Be it resolved that there shall be suitable advertising signs of the local church on the highway or highways approach and on the nearest through street to the church building, and on the church building.

12. Be it resolved that the District elect the members of the Camp Meeting Board.

13. We recommend that the course of study be purchased by ministerial candidates.

14. Be it resolved that each church make plans for an active Missionary Society. This society shall function for Home and Foreign Missions and both men and women shall participate.

15. Be it resolved that those who regularly use the lights and water from the Camp Ground, except the caretaker or district officials, shall pay the prevailing scale.

16. We recommend that the local Sunday School shall count as present those from the local Sunday School who are attending the Annual District Camp Meeting—the attendance to be counted only when a card is signed by the proper camp meeting authority.

17. Be it resolved that the retiring pastor of the local church shall make available to his successor an up-to-date record of the names and addresses of the members and friends of the local church.

18. Be it resolved that immediate steps be taken to minimize the fire hazard to Pilgrim Park and buildings. Be it further resolved that a committee shall be appointed and empowered by the District Council to do this.

19. Inasmuch as the Brotherhood Insurance Company of Fort Wayne, Indiana, is state accredited and a Mennonite sponsored, non-profit Insurance Company for churches, and inasmuch as this Insurance Company has made available to the Pilgrim Holiness Church its fire, wind, etc., insurance at one-half State listed cost, be it resolved that the Pacific Northwest District take advantage of this insurance in the local and district properties.

20. We recommend that the District Grounds at Salem shall be called "Pilgrim Park".

21. We recommend that the partition of "Pilgrim Park" bounded by Williams Ave. on the east and Stortz St. on the north, shall be set aside for our people to build a cottage on, and the cottage shall revert to the District at time of decease of the builders.

22. We recommend that whenever possible that the local church build a cabin at Pilgrim Park, and that the same shall be for the use of its pastors during Camp Meeting and Conference.

23. We recommend that the District Funds shall be kept in an account under the name of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

24. We recommend that an adequate charge for meals shall be made to cover the dining room expenses. And that the charge shall be made per dish or serving, and that a cashier shall collect for each meal, and that a committee composed of the purchasing agent, the cook and one active pastor appointed by the Council shall determine the charge per dish or per serving.

25. We recommend that those who are unable to pay for their entertainment at Camp Meeting shall be given the privilege of working for same as the opportunity affords, and food donations be accredited to meals' account.

26. We recommend that whenever feasible that a pastor of the district shall be called upon to help in a revival in another church on the district.

27. We recommend that a quarterly report from the District Treasurer be sent to each church.

28. We recommend: that the Zone Chairman shall be elected by the delegates and ministers of his Zone at each Conference. We further recommend: that the responsibilities and duties of the Zone Chairman shall be as follows:

- (1) To conduct at least one service in each church of his Zone in the interest of Home Missions and Church Extension and to take an offering for same.
- (2) To make contacts and seek for new openings in places or with peoples.
- (3) To launch at least one Home Missionary Campaign each year in co-operation with the church and pastors of his Zone.

29. We recommend: that the District Superintendent shall supervise at least two home missionary campaigns in new fields in behalf of Church Extension on this District this Conference year. And that the District shall support the pianist for these campaigns.

30. We recommend: That the Purchasing Agent shall be empowered to work out a plan for food donations in advance for each camp meeting, and it shall be of such nature as to include all friends and members of each church.

31. We recommend that each Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of the first week of each Camp Meeting shall be devoted exclusively to a District Youth Convention. And that suitable workers shall be engaged who shall be sponsored by the District Young People.

32. We recommend: That wherever feasible that no one member of the conference shall serve on more than one conference committee or board.

33. Be it resolved that all birthday offerings be used for Home Missions.

34. Be it resolved that a building program for Pilgrim Park be carried out. This is to include remodeling the kitchen, work on the pump house, toilets, etc.

35. Be it resolved that each church take a special offering each month to be divided equally between Home and Foreign Missions.

## SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Whereas Rev. R. A. Beltz, the General Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension has been permitted to be present at our Conference, be it resolved that we give him a rising vote of thanks.

2. Whereas, our District Superintendent, Rev. Roy E. Morgan and his wife, have devoted themselves to the responsibility of the District during the past year, be it resolved that we extend to them our utmost appreciation by standing to our feet.

3. Whereas Mrs. Woodruff and her assistants, Mrs. Davis, and Mrs. Morgan have worked so faithfully in the kitchen and dining room, be it resolved that we give them a rising vote of thanks.

4. Whereas we have been permitted to enjoy another camp meeting under the efficient leadership of Revs. P. O. Carpenter and S. I. Emery, and Mr. and Mrs. James Butler, be it resolved that we express our appreciation by a hearty Amen.

5. Resolved that the secretary send an expression of appreciation to the Portland Traction Company for permitting Camp posters to be placed in the Salem City buses and paying for the cost of the space.

6. Resolved that we send an expression of thanks to Mrs. Doris Willis for securing the advertising space on the buses and placing them there.
