FIRST SITTING — Monday 8:30 A.M., July 28, 1952

The second annual conference of the South Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at the Jonesboro, Ark., Pilgrim Holiness Church, Monday at 8:30 A. M., July 28, 1952.

The first session was opened with Mrs. O. E. Fields at the piano and Rev. W. Lloyd Smith leading the songs, "Beulah Land" and "Love Divine."

Mrs. Arnold Keyes of Hot Springs, Ark., offered prayer.

Rev. W. Lloyd Smith the District Superintendent presented Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension, of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to the Conference.

Rev. Beltz greeted the conference, then spoke from a portion of the 78th Psalm. His theme being "Cowards in Battle."

This was a stirring message on an aggressive warfare.

The Secretary then called the roll.

Motion was made by Rev. Smith and seconded by Bro. Johnson that the first four rows in the center section of the tabernacle and the platform constitute the bar.

Times of conference being 8:30 until 11:45 A.M.; but was extended until 12:00 because of resolution committee finishing report.

Due to absence of District Statistician Bro. Murray, Bro. Johnson, and Bro. Braden were appointed on this committee.

Bro. Braden gave the statistician report which was very good.

Motion made, second and accepted.

Brother Beltz gave talk on General Church program on Evangelism for their four-year period. Also hints for membership.

Bro. Crews reporting for Sunday School Committee. Poplar Bluff Sunday School was presented with certificate of achievement for greatest increase in Sunday School. Motion made, second and accepted.

Sister Fields reported on District Foreign Mission Work. Reporting two new societies in District.

Sister Eva Johnson reported for Memorial Committee.

Motion made, second and accepted.

Adjournment by prayer by Bro. Braden, at 12:00 noon.

SECOND SITTING — Monday 1:45 P.M., July 28, 1952

Second sitting convened at 1:45 p.m. The song service was conducted by Rev. W. Lloyd Smith, Mrs. O. E. Fields was at the piano. It was opened by singing, "Sweet Peace The Gift of God's Love," and "Love Divine." Rev. James Lighty led in prayer.

Brother Beltz spoke briefly on the Indian work in New Mexico, and their persecution. He read a letter received from Brother Wilkinson.

The Minutes of the first sitting were read by the secretary. They were approved.

Report of the Examining Board was read. Motion made and seconded that it be accepted. Carried.

Being ready for election of officers of the District, the conference knelt in prayer, led by Mrs. Arnold Keyes, to seek the will of God.

Rev. Beltz asked the District Superintendent to appoint the tellers. Brother Smith appointed Brothers Beatty and Lighty as tellers and Sister Keyes to assist at the black board.

Rev. Beltz appointed Rev. W. L. Smith, Rev. W. T. Johnson, Rev. O. E. Fields, Rev. L. A. Braden, Rev. Harold Penny as an Ordination Council.

With Mrs. Fields at the piano, Rev. O. E. Fields led the congregation in singing, "A Charge To Keep Have I." Rev. Smith led in prayer, after which "Rock of Ages" was sung. Rev. W. T. Johnson read from the Word, Timothy 1. Rev. Harold Penny read Timothy 4:1-8, Rev. L. A. Braden read Titus 3:1-11. Rev. Beltz then spoke to Brother Keyes concerning his calling and his ordination. The brethren then laid hands on Brother Keyes as Rev. Beltz prayed.

Motion made and second that inasmuch as the business being completed that we adjourn. Carried.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each church pay its offerings to deputational workers of the Owossa Bible College, Foreign Missions, Church Extension and the Pilgrim Youth Projects through the District Treasurer, so the District will receive credit for same.

3. Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to conduct two revival meetings away from his own charge each conference year, if it can be planned so as not to conflict with the local church work.

4. Be it resolved that the conference year close, June 30th. All church and Ministers reports shall be sent immediately to the District Statistician so he may compile his report before conference. The District Treasurer shall close his books on July 10th. (July Tenth).

Money therefore must be mailed to the District Treasurer by July 1st to be included in the annual report. By action of the conference all churches who pay their district and general budgets in full shall be counted as star churches.

5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees. All the above appointments shall be announced at the conference and their names be printed in the minutes.

6. Be it resolved that we have a Sunday School Rally as was provided in the previous general conference, and two sacred pictures or banners be provided by the District and given, one for the largest gain in attendance, over the previous quarter, and the other for the largest percentage gain over the previous quarter.

7. Be it resolved that all the telephone numbers of the ministers be included in the conference roll of the minutes.

8. Be it resolved that no minister or evangelist arrange his revival so as to conflict with the district camp and conference.

9. Be it resolved that the District Secretary issue credentials to those entitled them while they are at conference; and if they are not present, they shall be mailed.

10. Be it resolved that no church call an evangelist who is not a Pilgrim Holiness Minister without first consulting the District Superintendent.

11. Be it resolved that we be more firm in enforcing sec. 149 Par. 1, requiring licensed ministers to complete at least two subjects of the course of study each year.

12. Be it resolved that the district provide an educational board as provided by the manual for the benefit of those who cannot take the study course through the school.

13. Be it resolved that each pastor try to secure as many subscriptions to the "Advocate" as he has members.

14. Be it resolved that each pastor attend one Sunday of our District Camp Meeting.

15. Be it resolved that due to the smallness of our district and the expenses involved in calling council meetings and inasmuch as some home mission districts have 3-5 members on District Council, be it resolved that our District Council consist of 5 members.

16. Be it resolved that the Assistant District Superintendent visit each church in the interest of Budgets and the raising of other various monies.

17. Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to the following by standing and singing, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds":

- a. Rev. R. A. Beltz for the efficient way in which he conducted this conference, and for his great messages during the camp.
- b. Rev. W. L. Smith for his labors as our District Superintendent.
- c. Rev. W. T. Johnson our Assistant Superintendent for his faithfulness in his assistance to Bro. Smith during the past year.
- d. Rev. O. E. Fields our District Secretary for his faithfulness in his duties during the year.
- e. Rev. L. A. Braden our acting Treasurer for his labors and for looking after the financial part of the District.
- f. Rev. L. A. Crews and Rev. L. A. Braden our statisticians for compiling the statistics for conference.
- g. The Jonesboro Church and their efficient pastors Rev. and Mrs. O. E. Fields and for all they have done to entertain the camp and conference.

Resolutions Committee.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

We, the Ways and Means Committee, present the following recommendations:

1. That each member of voting age pay \$12.00 per year budget. That amount to be paid at the rate of \$1.00 per member per month, and to be sent to the district treasurer the first of each month.
2. We recommend that newly organized churches be assessed but one-fourth of their budget for the first year following their organization; one-half the second year; three-fourths the third year; and after the third year be assessed their full quota.
3. The district superintendent shall visit each church at least four times during the next year. There shall be preaching services at each of these visits. At each visit shall be an offering taken to apply on his traveling expenses. This amount shall be above the budget and shall be sent by the local treasurer to the district treasurer.
4. The district superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$60.00 per month. He shall be allowed mileage for district work at the rate of five cents per mile with a limit of 8000 miles for the next year. His necessary telephone and office expense shall be paid by the district.
5. Inasmuch as the Pension Plan for preachers has been passed by the general conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all of our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with the plan.

We recommend that District home missions calendars be distributed for the purpose of accumulating a penny a day per calendar for district home missions. This money shall be turned over to the local treasurer the first of each month and he shall forward it immediately to the district treasurer. That the Assistant Superintendent visit the churches in the interest of District Home Missions once a year.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the second annual conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in South Cental District: Greetings to our pastors, evangelists and delegates in the Name of our glorious Christ Who liveth forever and ever!

We wish to first render appreciation and thanks unto our God for His abundant blessings and mercies and leadership through this past year.

I wish also to voice my appreciation to my co-laborer and our assistant district Superintendent, Rev. W. T. Johnson. Also the fine district council who have given of their time for the advancement of the Kingdom.

As we have become better acquainted with the needs of the District, we have come to the realization that the great and paramount need is the establishing of several of our present churches into good, self-supporting churches. This will necessitate our using funds that we would like to be able to place in new fields. But a strong program of District Church extension, will depend upon strong, well established churches out over the district. The Lord is helping us, and for this we are grateful, but there is much yet to be accomplished. The key-man for this job is spiritual, aggressive pastors. Behind these pastors must be advisory boards who are willing to do all within their power to help their church and pastor make advancement.

In some parts of our District, money has not been as free this year. Some sections have lost people to defense work. But withal most of our churches have reported gains. All churches but one, have had revivals, and some have reported the best revivals in years, with increased attendance and new members added to the rolls. Most of our churches have paid all, or nearly all of their budgets. Some churches have made much needed repairs upon their property—others are planning improvements.

The Fall months should find us engaged in a Church extension meeting in the lovely city of Little Rock—where already we have some Pilgrims. Rev. Carol Kiger of the California conference held a meeting in a rented hall at Rich Hill, Mo., in the early summer and prospects are bright for a Pilgrim work in that splendid little city of some 2000 people. If Brother Kiger can make the right arrangements for school he plans to pastor the group at Rich Hill.

This year has not been without its problems and difficulties. Perhaps we have prayed more, than if these hard places had not come.

Within a short while we will be in the midst of enacting legislature for another year. Let us proceed carefully and prayerfully, and charter a course that will be spiritual and aggressive, in keeping with the great Program of Evangelism set by our General Church.

I appreciate our great Church and its leaders. I am a Pilgrim by choice, and by the grace of God expect to remain one and push the battle in our own Zion.

I have traveled over 11,000 miles this year in the work of the Lord. Having visited all our established churches—some many times. Attended three council meetings, and conducted all of the annual meetings but two. In November, the Jonesboro Church was the host to the services given our District by Rev. and Mrs. P. W. Thomas and Rev. E. V. Halt of Indianapolis, Indiana, in interest of the General Church program of Evangelism. I attended the Superintendents' Conference in January at our Headquarters in Indianapolis, and also the same month attended the great indoor Holiness Camp meeting, held in Cadle Tabernacle at Indianapolis. This truly was a feast of good things. In the month of March we enjoyed the Sunday School Convention conducted by our General Sunday School Secretary, Rev. P. F. Elliott, at our Stanley Church. In June we attended the second National Pilgrim Youth Convention at Frankfort, Indiana, for which Convention we served as pianist.

I have received my salary of sixty dollars per month in full, plus five cents per mile for 8000 miles driven in district work.
