CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The Tenth Annual Conference of the South-Central District, of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened in the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Poplar Bluff, Missouri, Saturday, June 18, 1960, at 10:00 A.M.

Conference opened with Billy Williams leading the congregation in singing "There Shall Be Showers of Blessings", and "Beulah Land". Bro. Phillips, pastor at Hot Springs, Arkansas led in prayer.

Rev. P. W. Thomas, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, and chairman for the conference, was introduced by Rev. Dwight M. Horn, District Superintendent.

After a few brief remarks by Bro. Thomas, the Conference roll was called.

Motion was made and carried that the first six seats on the south side of the church constitute the bar.

Motion made and carried that the morning sitting be from 10:00 A.M. until noon; the afternoon sitting from 1:00 P.M. until 4:00 P.M. or until all work was finished.

The District Superintendent Bro. Dwight M. Horn gave his report and a motion was made and carried that it be accepted.

The Assistant District Superintendent gave an oral report. Motion made and carried that we accept his report.

The District Treasurer Bro. L. A. Braden, gave his report. Motion made and carried to accept this report subject to the auditing of it as it had not been done as yet. Motion made and carried that the treasurer attach a memo of our liabilities and assets of the West Plains church located in Missouri.

The District Statistician, Bro. George W. Carr, gave his report. Motion made and carried that the report be accepted and that a column of figures be added which had been overlooked. The report was accepted with the understanding that those who did not get their reports

in, be contacted and their reports received and added to the Statistical report.

The Education and Examining Board gave their report and recommendations. A motion was made and carried that we accept the whole of their report and recommendations.

The Ways and Means Committee gave their report. Motion was made and carried that resolution Number One be substituted and that the substitute read: "Upon the visit of the District Superintendent to the local churches, an offering be taken for the United Stewardship Fund." The other resolutions were to remain as they were.

The Resolution Committee gave their report. Motion was made and carried that it be accepted.

Motion was made and carried that we adjourn for the noon meal.

SECOND SITTING

Saturday 1:00 P.M., June 18, 1960.

The second sitting of the Conference began with singing, after which Bro. L. A. Braden led in prayer.

Bro. Horn appointed tellers and the Conference elected officers for the new year.

The Reception Committee presented the new pastor of the Poplar Bluff church. His family was also presented to the Conference. Sister P. W. Thomas was also presented.

Motion made and carried to receive Bro. O. K. Biddlingmeier into the Conference.

Rev. Owen J. Phillips was elected to the Examining Board.

Motion made and carried that there be three of the Conference members elected for District Trustees and that their terms be staggered according to the votes they receive. The one receiving the highest number of votes would serve for three years; the one receiving the second highest would serve for two years; and the third highest for one year.

Motion made and carried that any unfinished business be referred to the District Council including final approval of the minutes of the Conference.

Motion made and carried that the Conference adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our chairman, Rev. P. W. Thomas, members and friends of the Annual Conference of the South-Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings:

We are grateful to the Lord for His overshadowing providence through another year and the privilege of gathering in another Annual Conference.

We are made more keenly aware of the rapidity of time and of our responsibility to serve this generation in the limited sphere of our calling to the best of our ability.

While world conditions may appear more and more uncertain, and spiritual indifference increasingly prevails, yet, this is our day of opportunity. We must occupy until He comes; We must work while it is day. The Master said, "The night cometh when no man can work."

There has been a good spirit of fellowship and co-operation from the Council, ministers and laymen of the District. This we have appreciated.

There have been some encouraging gains in some areas of our work while others have shown losses.

The Church property at Rich Hill was sold, the Church having been defunct for several years.

Our greatest disappointment was the unavoidable closing of our West Plains Church. We feel that everything was done that could have been done to save the church. After three pastoral try-outs which ended in failure, Bro. and Sr. Glen Dyer were finally secured to pastor the work. About the time they arrived on the field, one family had moved away and four other families left. This was a situation entirely beyond their control. They stayed with the church until spring. They worked hard and the District put everything it could into the work but it appeared to be a lost cause. There seemed to be no alternative but to close the work and endeavor to dispose of the property and heavy debt.

The pastors and people of our churches are to be commended for their faithful and sacrificial labors in

the face of some difficult situations. There has been a substantial increase in taking care of our General Church obligations and we should strive for a higher percentage.

The Hot Springs, Jonesboro, Paragould, Poplar Bluff, and Standley churches have each improved and redecoreated their church properties.

While we should not look for excuses to justify our losses or meager gains, yet statistics do not tell all the facts. Some have faced obstacles that have been very difficult to surmount. The loss in membership and Sunday School average has been due almost entirely to the loss of the West Plain church and some belated clearing of church roll.

Let us take courage and a fresh grip on the promises of God and work and pray for a spiritual revival that will bring new life into our churches.

I have preached 16 times on the District; made 18 visits to the churches; conducted 8 annual business meetings; presided over 5 district council meetings and 3 church board meetings. I attended the Church Leader's Conference at Indianapolis, Indiana, two Central Pilgrim College Board meetings at Bartlesville, Oklahoma and one Zone Rally. I made a trip to Rich Hill to make final disposition of the property, and five extra trips to West Plains in the interest of the church. I have traveled 8,754 miles in the interest of the District and received traveling expenses and salary in full.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Resolution Committee, present the following resolutions:

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each church pay its cash offering for duputational work of the Central Pilgrim College, Foreign Missions, Church Extension and Pilgrim Youth Project through the District Treasurer, so the District will receive credit for same.

3. Be it resolved that each pastor be allowed one two-week revival each year, and that he pay out of his salary the expense of the supplying the pulpit in his absence; that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation with pay, and that the church bear the expense of the substituting minister.

4. That the Conference year close April 30; all churches and ministers reports be typed and sent to the District Statistician by the 10th of May, so he may compile his report before Conference. That the District Treasurer shall close his books on May 15th and that our conference be the last part of June. Money therefore must be mailed to the District Treasurer by May 15th to be included in the annual report. By action of the Conference all churches who pay their district and general budget in full shall be counted as Star churches.

5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees, all these appointments shall be announced at the Conference and their names shall be printed in the minutes.

6. Be it resolved that no minister or evangelist arrange his revival so as to conflict with District Camp and Conference.

7. Be it resolved that all telephone numbers of the ministers be included in the conference roll of the minutes.

8. Be it resolved that the District Secretary issue credentials to those entitled to them while they are at the Conference, or if absent, they shall be mailed.

9. Be it resolved that no church call an evangelist who is not a Pilgrim Holiness Minister without first consulting the District Superintendent.

10. Be it resolved that we be firm in enforcing Sec. 222, Par. 3, 1, "requiring licensed ministers to complete at least two subjects in the course of study each year."

11. In as much as the General Board has zoned our District as a part of the Central Pilgrim College School Zone, be it resolved: That we as a district assume a Bible College budget for Central Pilgrim College of \$5.00 per member for the coming year.

12. Be it resolved that each pastor endeavor to secure subscriptions to the Advocate for each family that attends our Sunday School and church.

13. Be it resolved that each minister attend our camp and conference.

14. Be it resolved that we have a District Young People's Convention, the time and place to be determined by the Council.

15. Be it resolved that we have a Ministerial Convention in the spring, the place to be chosen by the District Council.

16. Be it resolved that we strongly urge each church to conduct a Daily Bible School and report to be made at the District Conference.

17. Be it resolved that in as much as our Church Manual is definitely against any form of dancing, be it resolved that we as a District let school authorities know how we stand on the subject and ask that our children not be compelled to take part in such school affairs where dancing is the entertainment.

18. Be it resolved that the pastor of the church see that the report of the Sunday School be sent to the Sunday School Promotional Secretary by the fifth of each month.

19. Be it resolved that before any church enters into any building project of \$500.00 or more, that the matter be cleared with the District Council.

20. Be it resolved we express our appreciation to the following: Rev. P. W. Thomas, for efficient way in which he conducted the conference; Rev. D. M. Horn, District Superintendent, for his labors on our District; and the Poplar Bluff Church, as host for the Camp and Conference.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Ways and Means Committee, present the following recommendations:

The District Superintendent shall visit each church at least two times during the next year. There shall be preaching services at each of the visits. At each visit there shall be an offering taken to apply on the United Stewardship Fund.

The District Superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$40.00 per month. He shall be allowed milage for District work at the rate of six cents per mile for the next year, and necessary telephone and office expenses shall be paid for the District.

In-as-much as the Pension Plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with the plan.

In-as-much as there is a General Conference expense to be raised by each district, we recommend that this money be raised at the Zone Rallies each month. For churches which do not attend the rallies, we recommend that they receive an offering each month for this General Conference expense, this money to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

We recommend that each church place in their budget

\$5.00 per member each year for our zone school, Central Pilgrim College.

We recommend that twenty-five cents per member be paid each year to the equalization of carfare committee for the travel of the School Board.

We recommend that each church pay their pastor and his wife's assessment fees if they are members of the Ministerial Benefit Association.
