CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

The Twelfth Annual Conference of the South Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened in the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Poplar Bluff, Missouri, Wednesday, June 27, 1962, at 8:00 A. M.

The Conference opened with Sis. Rachel Williams leading the congregation in singing "He Hideth My Soul". Rev. Jesse Beatty led us to the throne in prayer.

The District Supt., Rev. Dwight M. Horn, introduced Rev. Melvin Synder, The General Supt. of our area. Rev. Synder read from Romans 12 for our devotion and made some timely remarks.

The Secretary called the roll.

A motion was made and carried to have the first five seats on the South side of the church form the conference bar.

A motion was made and carried that the conference adjourn at 12:00 or sooner if the business was finished before then.

The District Supt., Rev. Horn, gave his report and it was accepted.

The Examining and Education Committee gave their report and their recommendations were accepted.

The Assistant Supt., Bro. Wilson, gave an oral report and it was accepted.

The District Treasurer gave his report and it was accepted.

The District Statistician gave his report and it was accepted.

The District Sunday School Promotional Secretary gave an oral report and it was accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee did not recommend any changes.

The report of the Auditing Committee was given. They reported the District Treasurer's Books correct and in order.

Rev. Synder talked to the conference about the South-Central District merging with the Oklahoma District. A motion was made and carried to vote on the merger. The vote was taken with 16 ballots cast - 15 in favor and 1 against. The following is the merger proposals which were passed one at a time by the conference:

- (1) We recommend that the name of the merged districts be South-Central District.
- (2) At this conference we elect just an assistant District Superintendent.
- (3) At this conference we elect all other members of the council.
- (4) That it be understood that all the executive members will be retained on the united council and advisory members will be retained according to the number of votes received, in order to have a council composed of nine members for the first year.
- (5) It is agreed that the Executive Council shall appoint for the first year a secretary and treasurer from those already elected by the two conferences. Both officers shall not come from the same district. That these offices be divided between the districts for the next three years.

- (6) It is agreed that the executive council shall appoint the District Supt. and the appointment shall be for a two-year term.
- (7) It is agreed that the merged council shall select if possible a central location for the entire area for the residency of the District Superintendent.
- (8) In case the Supt. is appointed from the present personnel of the two districts, the district from which the Supt. is appointed shall have for the first year a total of four members on the council and the other district shall have five members - making a council of nine members for the first year.
- (9) It is further agreed that after the first year the council shall revert to a council of seven members as provided for in the manual.

Bro. John Wilson was elected to serve as a trustee.

Motion made and carried that the District Trustees be authorized to sign any papers necessary for the merging of the districts.

Bro. L. A. Crews was elected for a three-year term on the examining and education committee.

Motion made to express our thanks to Bro. & Sis. Horn for their labors of love on the district. This was done by standing and also giving them an offering.

Motion was made to express our thanks for Bro. Synder being with us to conduct our conference.

Motion made to leave any unfinished business with the council. Motion made to adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our chairman, Rev. Melvin Synder, Gen. Supt., ministers, lay delegates, and friends of the Annual Conference of the South Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings.

In the providence of God, we are permitted to gather again in another Annual Conference to review our labors of the past year, make plans for the future, and earnestly seek the will of God in all things.

We believe perilous times are upon us, in a world that is confused, frustrated, and uncertain. A world that is trying to find its way through materialism, intellectualism, and ecclesiasticism. A time when the Church has been faced with Satanic opposition and according to the Scriptures it will be increasingly so the nearer that we get to the return of our Lord.

We have his promise that the gates of hell shall not prevail against the true Church, the "called out ones", and we are assured that the "foundation of God standeth sure." Our bulwark is in God.

We have appreciated the good spirit of the fellowship and co-operation from the council, ministers, and laymen of the District.

It seems we have made a very small gain in church membership, but have sustained a slight loss in Sunday

School attendance. Our lack of advancement is disturbing to us; however, we should make it a challenging factor for the future. Some individual churches, however, have shown a gain.

Amidst our difficult financial situation God has helped us clear the debt which was left after the sale of the West Plains Church property. For this we are grateful.

Our greatest need to strengthen the District financially is a response to the District Budget as possible by the local churches.

I am sure it is the desire of all our pastors and people to see the work go forward. Our only hope in the face of some very difficult situations and a lethargetic Laodicean age is in the evergiving power of the Holy Spirit enabling us to press forward and carry out the great commission until he comes. Let us not be weary in well doing for we shall reap if we faint not.

The pastors and churches are to be commended for their faithful and devoted efforts to carry on the work. Statistics do not tell the whole story. God's records are final and his rewards are right. May God help us to find his way for the future advancement of his kingdom and the work our of church.

MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

The Caruthersville Church decorated the interior of their parsonage and they are beginning a Sunday School annex building project.

The Hot Springs Church has purchased some new much needed pews and pulpit furniture, which adds comfort and beauty to their sanctuary.

The Poplar Bluff Church installed a new furnace in the parsonage.

The Springfield Church put a new roof on their personage.

The Stanley Church has about completed a new Sunday School annex.

PERSONAL REPORT

I have preached 13 times on the District; made 17 visits to the churches, including 4 with Bro. & Sis. R. G. Flexon; conducted six annual business meetings; presided over five District Council Meetings and two local church board meetings.

I attended the Church Leader's Conference at Indianapolis, Indiana; the Annual Board Meeting of Central Pilgrim College at Bartlesville, Oklahoma; one Zone Rally and the General Conference at Winona Lake, Indiana.

I have traveled 7781 miles in the interest of the District and received salary and mileage.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Resolution Committee, present the following resolutions:

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect year to year except when revoked by this District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each church pay its cash offerings for deputational work on the Central Pilgrim College, Foreign Missions, Church Extension, and Pilgrim

Youth Project through the District Treasurer, so the District will receive credit for the same.

3. Be it resolved that each pastor be allowed one two-week revival each year, and that he pay out of his salary the expenses of supplying the pulpit in his absence; that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation with pay, and that the church bear the expense of the substituting minister.

4. That the Conference year close April 30; all churches and ministers reports be typed and sent to the District Statistician by the 10th of May, so he may compile his report before Conference. That the District Treasurer shall close his books on May 15th and that our Conference be the last part of June. Money, therefore, must be mailed to the District Treasurer by the 15th of May to be included in the annual report. By action of the Conference all churches who pay their District and General budget in full shall be counted as Star Churches.

5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees, all these appointments shall be announced at the Conference and their names shall be printed in the minutes.

6. Be it resolved that no minister or evangelist arrange his revival so as to conflict with the District Camp and Conference.

7. Be it resolved that all telephone numbers of the ministers be included in the Conference roll of the minutes.

8. Be it resolved that the District Secretary issue credentials to those entitled while they are at the conference, or if absent, they shall be mailed.

9. Be it resolved that no church call an evangelist who is not a Pilgrim Holiness Minister without

first consulting the District Superintendent.

10. Be it resolved that we be firm in enforcing Sec. 222, Par. 3, requiring licensed ministers to complete at least two subjects in the course of study each year.

11. Be it resolved that each pastor endeavor to secure subscriptions to the Advocate for each family that attends our Sunday School and Church.

12. Be it resolved that we have a District Young People's Convention, the time and place to be determined by the Council.

13. Be it resolved that we have a Ministerial Convention in the Spring, the place to be chosen by the District Council.

14. Be it resolved that each minister attend our camp and conference.

15. Be it resolved that we strongly urge each church to conduct a Daily Vacation Bible School and report to be made at the District Conference.

16. Be it resolved that in as much as our Church Manual is definitely against any form of dancing, we as a district let school authorities know how we stand on the subject and ask that our children not be compelled to take part in such school affairs where dancing is the entertainment.

17. Be it resolved that the pastor of the church see that the report of the Sunday School be sent to the Sunday School Promotional Secretary by the fifth of each month.

18. Be it resolved that before any church enters into any building project of \$500.00 or more that the

matter be cleared with the District Council.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

We, The Ways and Means Committee, present the following recommendations:

1. That each church pay 10% of all tithes and regular offerings to the District and they be sent no later than the first of each month to the District Treasurer.
2. The District Superintendent shall visit each church at least two times during the year. There shall be preaching service at each visit and an offering shall be taken to apply on the United Stewardship Fund.
3. The District Superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$40 per month. He shall be allowed mileage for District work at the rate of six cents per miles for the next year, and the necessary telephone and office expense shall be paid by the District.
4. In as much as the Pension Plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all our pastors and evangelists to co-operate with the plan.
5. In as much as there is a Gen. Conference expense to be raised by each District, we recommend that this money be raised at the Zone Rallies each month. For

churches which do not attend the rallies, we recommend that they receive an offering each month for the same and that it be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend that each church place in their budget \$5 per member each year for Central Pilgrim College, our Zone School.

7. We recommend that \$.25 per member be paid each year to the equalization of carfare committee for the College Board travel expense.

8. We recommend that each church pay the assessment fees of their pastor and his wife if they are members of the Ministerial Benefit Association.
