PROCEEDINGS

The Twentieth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrims Holiness Church of the Southern District convened at 10:00 a. m. on the 29th of July, 1930, at the First Pilgrim Holiness Church of Greensboro, N. C., in conformity with the resolution adopted at our last District Assembly that it should be held one month prior to our General Assembly, which convenes at Frankfort, Indiana, the first week in September.

Rev. W. A. Way, our District Superintendent, read a portion of the 23rd chapter of Matthew, followed by prayer by Mrs. J. B. Fulp and Rev. J. F. Talbirt, thanking the Lord for his presence and beseeching him to lead in all our deliberations. Rev. W. R. Cox, pastor of the First church, bid the assembly welcome and also made a short talk on the first Pentecostal convention, the record of which is found in Acts, emphasizing the fact that they were all filled with the Holy Ghost and were all of one heart and will and mind—one common purpose—i. e., to keep the tide rising and flowing as on the Day of Pentecost.

Brother Way in his address emphasized the fact that we need a more devoted and consecrated ministry, all on the altar to go and do and be; that when the Lord says, "Go," we will go; then He will put his stamp upon us; that we also need a consecrated laity, consecrated enough to pay one-tenth of their income. He explained that there are four classes of people who give: tippers, tithers, givers, and those who sacrifice. "The tipper is one who gives a small amount just to be religious and courteous; when able to pay a tithe, they only tip the church and the pastor. Then there are the people who are conscientious tithers and give their tithe willingly, not just because they have it to do. The people who give are those who give after they have tithed. Then the people who sacrifice are those who give when their own family are in need, but they feel that the work of the Lord is suffering and they give when it hurts them. What we need in the Southern District today is sacrifice on the part of the ministry and on the part of the laity. Then the wheels of Zion will roll."

The following business was transacted:

The first five rows of the two tiers in front of the platform of the camp meeting tabernacle, which is being used in place of the church on account of the hot weather, was set apart as the conference bar.

Rev. J. F. Woods, District Superintendent of the West Virginia District, was presented to the assembly and given an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Motion carried that we recognize Charles Williams, of Salisbury, who is a fraternal delegate from the Young Peoples' Conference, as a regular delegate to our assembly.

It was decided that the business sessions of the assembly be held from 9:30 a. m. to 12:00 m., and from 2:00 p. m. to 4:00 p. m., with religious services at night.

Motion carried that the chair appoint the several committees needed. The following were named:

Sisters Knight and Dean, from California, who are doing missionary work in the mountains of North Carolina, were presented to the assembly and given a seat in the conference bar.

Motion carried that Brother Tanner, who comes to us from the Free Methodist church, become a member of our conference.

Motion carried that we rescind the action of our last district assembly; viz., "Since our people see the reports of the different churches as they appear in the minutes, be it resolved that all ministers and delegates hand their reports to the secretary, and be allowed to give a brief, verbal report of their work." However, that they be allowed to give a short verbal report of their work.

As there was only a short time before the regular time for adjournment, the reading of reports was postponed until the afternoon session.

Adjournment was made until 2:00 p. m.

RESOLVED, That our church shall be divided into seven geographical divisions; viz:

1. Western—California, Washington, Idaho.
2. Mid-Western—Colorado, Nebraska, Western Kansas.
3. Central, Indiana, Kentucky.
4. Michigan. Ohio.
5. Eastern Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, (Missouri District).
6. Eastern—New York, Pennsylvania, Maryland.
7. Southern—North Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia.

RESOLVED^d That there shall be one general correlated board consisting of 14 members to represent all the church interests.

RESOLVED, That each of the seven districts shall have two representatives on said correlated board, elected as follows: each district assembly shall nominate four men from this nomination; two shall be elected by the General Assembly. Said correlated board shall organize itself into three divisions, as follows:

1. Five on foreign missions.
2. Five on home missions and charitable institutions.
3. Four on education and publication.

RESOLVED, That each geographical division be organized in one district organization.

RESOLVED, That the correlated board be empowered to appoint, dismiss, and transfer district superintendents for each of these districts. It is understood that these district superintendents shall give their entire time to the work of the district and be compensated from the general church treasury at the rate of \$1,800.00 per year.

Considerable time was taken in discussion of the first resolution and when voted upon, it was lost. As it carried with it the four following resolutions, it was needless to discuss them.

Adjournment was taken until 2:00 p. m.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional exercises conducted by W. B. Creech, prayer by O. L. Ruth, the minutes of last session were read and approved, the following resolution was brought before the assembly:

RESOLVED, That the district have one full time district superintendent and he shall give one three-day meeting in connection with each quarterly meeting, and when unable to fill the appointment, he shall call upon the assistant superintendent to supply for him. He shall receive his traveling expenses and also raise the quota due the district superintendent.

Adopted.

Rev. Mr. Graham, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and Rev. Harry Felter, of the New York District, were recognized and presented to the assembly.

Rev. C. A. Brown, who had been suffering with a nervous breakdown for the past five years, was in attendance and asked to come forward and give report of his healing, which precipitated a time of rejoicing and thanksgiving for His wonderful power.

The report of the district superintendent was read and accepted. He reported having received all by about \$78.00 of the amount promised him for the year by the assembly. The churches were urged to raise the deficit.

The committee on credentials reported and recommended that C. A. Briggman, Willie Deal and Colon Reynolds be given license to preach and that Robert I. McCluskey be ordained. The assembly also recommended that Rev. C. W. Hartman, Rev and Mrs. J. B. Fulp, and Rev. T. R. York be ordained. The ordination service was made the orders of the day for 11:00 a. m. Friday morning. The committee also recommended that we accept Rev. L. C. Stevens, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with the standing that he had with that organization.

The election of officers was then the order of the day, which resulted in the following:

Motion carried that we elect the delegates to the General Assembly by nomination and acclamation.

The report of the district treasurer was read and accepted subject to the report of the auditing committee.

The assembly adjourned to meet at 8:30 o'clock Friday morning.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. A. C. Tanner, prayer by Brother Spagh.

The auditing committee reported that the books of the treasurer were in excellent shape.

The ordination charge was delivered by Rev. W. R. Cox, after which adjournment was made to 2:00 p. m.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Rev. L. C. Stevens conducted devotional exercises and after prayer the minutes of preceding session were read and approved. The following business was transacted:

The committee on resolutions brought in the following:

RESOLVED, That 25 per cent of the home missionary money go to help defray the expenses of the one who may be assigned to our mountain work upon the strength that he give a quarterly report showing that he is making satisfactory advancement. Adopted.

Motion carried that the district raise an amount equal to half the railroad fare of the delegates going to and from the general assembly, and that such amount be distributed among the churches according to their numerical and financial strength and that this apportionment be made by the district council.

Motion carried that we pay the full fare of the district superintendent to and from the General Assembly.

The committee on Memoirs read their report which was accepted, copy of which appears in the minutes.

The committee on memorials to the General Assembly brought forward the following which were acted upon:

RESOLVED, That all ministerial delegates elected to the General Assembly shall be actively engaged, ordained ministers, who have rendered at least four years' successful service in the Pilgrims Holiness Church. Adopted.

RESOLVED, That any church or pastor failing to raise their budget and having no good reason therefor shall be denied a voice in the district assembly. Adopted.

RESOLVED, That when any member of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall move into a community in which a Pilgrim Holiness Church is located, his pastor shall mail his letter to the pastor in the said community.

Amended to read, If he has been a resident six months in the community in which he is located.

Amendment passed, amended motion lost.

RESOLVED, That we have one general church headquarters, located at Frankfort, Indiana. Adopted.

RESOLVED, That all licensed preachers shall serve as assistant pastors for at least two years, without compensation from the church, before being placed as pastors.

Amended to drop the clause, Without compensation from the church.

Resolution voted down.

RESOLVED, That all preachers feeling led to the evangelistic field shall be specially commissioned by the District Assembly only after serving at least two years successfully on a pastorate.

Resolution voted down.

Whereas, there develops an occasional difficulty in a district in the calling or dismissing of a pastor, or in handling some local situation to save the peace and prosperity of the work in the locality, and that often the local church is unable to handle the situation; be it therefore RESOLVED, That in such cases the district council shall have power to place or remove the pastor, or any member of the local advisory board, or to regulate any other difficulty which may need their services. Adopted.

The report of the statistical committee was read and accepted. This report showed a gratifying increase in membership during the past year.

Motion carried that the time for our annual assembly be the next week after the fourth Sunday in September.

The list of appointments was read.

Several of the ministers present pledged to take certain amounts of the

printed minutes and motion carried that any deficit be borrowed from the general funds and this deficit be replaced later when the minutes are sold.

A rising vote of thanks was given the local church for the royal entertainment provided the assembly and also Brother Gaither who left no stone unturned to provide for the needs of the ministers and delegates.

Motion carried that Brother Cox write a letter to the business men of the city who have kindly helped in the entertainment.

The district secretary was given \$5.25 as an offering for her year's work. The statistical committee was given a vote of thanks for their splendid work in tabulating the reports.

As there are several new pastors placed on the different charges, motion carried that we leave until a later date the selection of a place for our next district assembly.

The retiring district superintendent was also accorded a vote of thanks for his good work during the past year and his good work in directing the work of the assembly.

The assembly adjourned.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT.

I feel that the length of this Conference year justifies a better report than I am able to give as District Superintendent; but the dear Lord knows I have tried to do my best under the existing circumstances and conditions.

The financial status of the country has taken the wind of aspirations out of our sails and has a tendency to discourage, but in spite of all this as the colored folk melody goes, "We have been inching along."

One church has been organized. One nice brick church under construction and besides improvements being made on some churches. Two new tabernacles have been erected and a good size gospel tent has been purchased and paid for. With our pastoral duties and the work of the district, it is needless for me to say that I have been busy and in times almost pressed out of measure. But I have enjoyed good health and found it a great delight to work for God. I feel that I have more religion and enjoy greater victory in my soul than ever before. With the exception of two or three places, I have visited all of the churches from one to three or four times. I have traveled in the interest of the district work 4,451 miles, and received from the treasurer \$188.99 and from the churches \$256.43 total received \$4,45.47 from our work as district superintendent. Revival offerings, \$141.01.
