PROCEEDINGS

The Twenty-seventh Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Southern District met in annual session at the Burlington church on October 5, 1937, at 10:00 a. m., with Gen. Supt. Rev. W. L. Surbrook in the chair. Bro. Surbrook read the 90th Psalm. "Let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us and the work of our hands establish thou it." Bro. Clark Frazier, of California, a former member of the Pilgrim Holiness church, and District Superintendent of this district, but who is now a member of the Church of the Nazarene, led us to the throne in prayer, followed by Bro. R. I. McCluskey, pastor of the First Greensboro church.

An address of welcome was made by Bro. Barger, pastor of the Burlington church, stating his pleasure in having the Assembly as his guest.

Bro. Surbrook unburdened his heart regarding the need in our District of a district camp meeting as an encouragement, help and blessing to the pastors, using as evangelists, men who hew right down the old-fashioned line. He also spoke of the lack in some churches in properly supporting their pastor. He said that in the depression we went down slowly until we struck the bottom and seem to have stuck there and the pastor left without strength or energy, barely making ends meet. Our evangelists also should receive better offerings. He said, "Let us march on and keep going with plenty of faith and fire, keep anointed, blessed and filled with glory."

The roll was called and completed. The Assembly bar was fixed to take in the main auditorium in front of the stove and also include the platform. The hours for business sessions were fixed: 9:00, 11:30 a. m.; 2:00 and 4:30 p. m. Evangelistic services at night.

Bros. Deal and Saunders were appointed on the Reception Committee.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

•

The General Superintendent gave an impassioned appeal for the young churches, treating them as we would our children. The General Board is asking that we relieve them of half of their responsibility to the District, to the General work, and to Foreign Missions for three years after their organization. He urged us to organize more churches and to make progress to keep from stagnating.

The Assembly recessed for lunch.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Bro. Ruth read a part of the 6th chapter of II Corinthians, and Rev. Elmor Hanna, of Illinois, led in prayer. The roll call was dispensed with for the remainder of the Assembly.

The District Superintendent presented to the Assembly the new church at Thurman, 12 miles north of Elkin. He explained that the church membership is not large and we have no building, but a lot has been secured. The new church was accepted heartily.

The statistical report was read, total report was read, totals only, and accepted with the condition that the District Council be authorized to include the values not included in the church reports.

The Auditor's report was read and accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted. The Treasurer also explained a chart he had prepared in order that each church could see where it stood with its offerings in relation to the other churches.

The General Superintendent made an appeal to our District to give more to the Home Work. He explained that unless this was done it would be suicidal to our work. A motion carried that the Ways and Means committee look into this.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. Elmor Hanna, of the Illinois District, also Rev. and Mrs. Clark Frazier, of the Church of the Nazarene, of California.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

We recommend that the resolution which refers to the District Superintendent's support read \$150.00 per month instead of \$1800.00 per year. Adopted.

Memorials 1 to 6 inclusive were passed by the Assembly.

The session adjourned by expiration of time.

Resolutions committee reported and the following were carried:

Resolved that we appoint a committee to draft a report blank to be taken to the General Assembly.

Resolved that each pastor recommend to his congregation that those who attend the District Assembly who are not delegates, or ministers, or minister's wives, will be expected to take care of their own expenses—board and room.

Memorial No. 7 for the General Assembly was passed.

The session adjourned by expiration of time.

WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

Several special requests came in for prayer, Bro. Hanna carried them to the Throne, followed by Bro. Cockman. The General Superintendent read 1. Corinthians 9:16, "For though I preach the gospel, I have nothing to glory of for necessity is laid upon me. Yet woe is me if I preach not the gospel." That is if I preach a lot of my own silly notions, and Bro. Surbrook gave some concrete examples of some of these silly notions which have been preached to the people. He said that the preacher should be motivated by one subject and desire, one aim, to persuade men Godward.

The Reception committee presented Rev. Howard, who has recently united with us, coming from the Baptist church; also Rev. Clarence Winslow, from the Virginia District.

The Ways and Means Committee reported and the following were adopted; Since the General Board has ruled

the exemption of budget per cent, from evangelists outside the District, we also recommend that our District evangelists' offerings be exempted also. Adopted.

We recommend that pledges be taken from the Assembly floor to continue payments on the Bible School.

We recommend that each church pay 16% of all regular church and Sunday School offerings, and that the District Superintendent check the records on each visit and urge each church to come up with their amount, by referring to Section 82, par. 3.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The session was opened with prayer by Rev. W. A. Way, of the Edgeville church. The minutes were read, corrected and approved.

The Resolutions' Committee reported:

Resolved that our District Council be given the privilege of selling, or trading our Bible School property for a camp meeting ground, suitable also for a Bible School. Carried.

Monthly pledges were given for the Bible School building. These appear in the statistics on the Financial Report.

The committees on Examination and Education made report.

The election of officers was held with the following result:

Bro. Ruth was re-elected on Board of Examination, term expiring in 1940.

Bro. Deal was elected to take the place of Bro. Brown, who resigned, from the Board of Education, term expiring 1938. Sister Anthony was re-elected on this Board, term expiring 1940.

It was found that we are entitled to five ministerial delegates and six lay delegates to the General Assembly. As the District Council is better acquainted with eligible candidates, they were asked to retire and nominate a sufficient number of names. The following ministers were elected: R. I. McCluskey, W. A. Way, T. C. Vaughn, T. R. York, W. S. Deal.

Alternates: G. A. Castevens, J. F. Talbirt, J. A. Grout.

The election of lay delegates was put into the hands of the District Council as they are better acquainted with the personnel of available candidates than the Assembly. Six delegates, five alternates.

Motion carried that there be a committee appointed from the Council to select a District camp meeting site, this committee to include the District Superintendent and two other members.

Motion carried that our Secretary send Bro. Schoombie a letter of condolence from the Assembly.

The appointment of the Standing Committees was left in the hands of the District Superintendent, who appointed the following:

Auditing—R. I. McCluskey, Mrs. Saunders, Mrs. Story.

An offering was taken for our General Superintendent to be turned over to the General Treasurer and credited on our General Budget.

A report came to us of the oppression of the enemy through which our brother Robert Andrew is undergoing and special prayer with the blessing of God upon us was made for him and the Secretary was instructed to write him a letter of sympathy.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered to Bro. Barger, the good people of the Burlington church and their friends for the splendid entertainment, the beautiful flowers, and all their kindness shown to us for our comfort.

Our District Superintendent was voted a two weeks' vacation with pay.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered our General Superintendent for the admirable way in which he has conducted the Assembly.

The District Superintendent was empowered to appoint an editing committee for the Minutes and they were ordered to have 700 printed.

The General Superintendent brought to our attention the desirability of the Ministerial Benefit Association.

Motion carried that we accept the invitation of the Randleman Church for the Ministerial Convention, and that it be held the first week in April 1938, beginning on Tuesday morning.

The names of the ministers were called and responded with the number of subscriptions they will endeavor to get for the Advocate. 540 were pledged. This appears on statistical report, pastor's sheet.

Motion carried that we accept the invitation of the High Point church for the District Assembly next year, to convene at 10:00 a. m., the Second Tuesday after the last Sunday in September.

During the afternoon session Rev. Nall, of the Baptist church was presented to the Assembly.

Mrs. Surbrook sang very feelingly, "I know a Name." Jessie is one of our girls and we are always pleased to have her in our midst.

Our General Superintendent commented on the sweet spirit that was manifested throughout the Assembly. He admonished us many times to greater activity for the Lord and we trust that as we enter another year for Him, that much more will be accomplished than we have ever known in one year before.

Report of The District Superintendent

Greetings to the Twenty-seventh Annual Assembly of the Southern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in session at Burlington, N. C.

We are finishing the work of another Assembly year, which to my mind has been one of the very best in the history of the District, if not the best. In some respects, at least, there have been some of the greatest gains we have ever had. While there is room for improvement, yet, as a whole, our pastors have received a better support, many of our churches have made splendid repairs and improvements, much of which has been entirely paid for, and much of the indebtedness reported a year ago has been cancelled. Praise the Lord!

Many of our Sunday Schools have made splendid gains and are doing the best work in their history, while the gains in our church membership as a whole have been very encouraging, some having more than doubled during the year. Considering everything, I believe the District is in the best growing condition it has been for many years. These conditions have been brought about by the untiring efforts of our splendid pastors and workers and the excellent cooperation of our good Pilgrims and friends. There is much land ahead to be possessed, but by the grace of God we are well able to possess it. Brethren, let us go forward!

One new church has been organized and at least four or five new preaching points opened where organizations can be established, no doubt, within the next year or two. Please pray to this end.

Your District Superintendent has received for support \$1,800.00; has traveled 28,370 miles; 19,000 for the district; 6,000 for the general church, and 3,370 for himself. Traveling expenses, at $2\frac{1}{2}\phi$ per mile for the district, has cost me \$475.00. The Lord has enabled me to put into

His work \$493.16. I have preached 149 times; conducted 131 business meetings, prayed and called in 220 homes; presided in one District Assembly and assisted in another; attended two General Board meetings and one Executive Council meeting; conducted one revival and assisted to some extent, at least, in eight others; conducted one funeral and assisted in several others; and have married one couple during the year; have seen quite a few pray through under my own ministry, but have left the counting to the pastors.

I have unusually good health. God has marvelously taken care of me as I have gone up and down the country and, by His grace, I am enjoying the best victory of my life. Praise the Lord!

**Report of The Committee
 on Resolutions**

No. 1. Resolved that we appoint a committee to draft a report blank to be taken to the General Assembly. Appointed Ruth, Vaughn.

No. 2. Resolved that each pastor recommend to his congregation that those who attend the District Assembly, who are not delegates, or ministers, or minister's wives, will be expected to take care of their own expenses—board and room.

No. 3. Resolved that our District Council be given the privilege of selling, or trading, our Bible School property for a camp meeting ground suitable also for a Bible School. Carried.

Report of The Committee on Ways and Means

No. 1. We recommend that the resolution which refers to the District Superintendent's support read \$150.00 per month instead of \$1800.00 per year.

No. 2. Since the General Board has ruled the exemption of budget per cent. from evangelists from outside the District, we also recommend that our District Evangelists' offerings be exempted also.

No. 3. We recommend that pledges be taken from the Assembly floor for the Bible School to continue the payments.

No. 4. We recommend that each church pay 16% of all regular church and Sunday School offerings and that the District Superintendent check the records on each visit and urge each church to come up with their amount by referring to Sec. 82, par 3.

Memorials to General Assembly

1. Whereas there has been some contention and much confusion over our church name because of there being so many other different bodies styling themselves "Holiness," oftentimes hindering our work, especially in new fields of labor; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That we drop the word, "Holiness," from our church name, giving us the name, "Pilgrim Church."

2. Whereas our general church is divided into four departments: namely, Education, Publication, Foreign Missions, and Home Missions; and, Whereas in our present set-up only one department is represented on the Executive Council; and, Whereas, the duties of the Executive Council are greatly limited to the spheres of these four departments; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the General Assembly revise our set-up so that each department shall be represented on the Executive Council;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Executive Council shall be composed of the General Superintendent, General Secretary, General Treasurer, and the Executive Secretaries of the four departments;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the First and Second Assistant General Superintendents and the General Secretary of Foreign Missions shall be eligible for election as an Executive Secretary of one of these departments.

3. Whereas there is nothing in our Church Manual that gives us a right to deal with a member for minor offenses, except as set forth in the judiciary; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that for all minor offenses the individual be dealt with according to Mat. 18:15-17 if the individual refuses to line up, and that the pastor, when possible, secure a signed statement from the person, requesting that his or her name be dropped from the church roll.

4. Since it would be a very rare thing that individuals would confess any impediment that would lawfully prohibit them from being married; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That paragraph 1, on page 113, be stricken from the marriage ceremony.

5. Resolved that this portion of Sec. 63, page 46, be deleted from the Manual. "And if it be known that a candidate for an office is a divorced person and is living in a state of wedlock with another party, or is married to a divorced person of such state."

6. Whereas, many of our newly organized churches struggle heroically for an existence and find it almost impossible to meet their obligations without carrying any general or district obligations; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That we relieve all newly organized churches of 50% of their Foreign Missionary,

General Budget, and District obligations, or until the District Council deems that they are sufficiently able to assume the full load.

7. As Par. 83, Sec. 15, the last clause reads: "The paragraph form shall be used in printing statistics and the grand totals shall be given on a separate page; and, since some districts prefer their statistics printed in tabulated form; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the form of printing be left to the various Districts. All of the above were adopted.
