FIRST BUSINESS SESSION

AUGUST 28, 1944 8:30 A. M.

Opened with song service followed with prayer by Rev. A. L. Davis.

Our Second Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk was introduced by Rev. Denver Musser, our District Superintendent, as presiding officer of the Conference and spoke from the subject; "Our Church and the things upon which it depends."

His address was so instructive and pointed that it should be remembered and heeded by everyone present, especially the ministry. He said, among many other good things; "My burden for the church is that it may be united," and, "If we are going to succeed as a CHURCH we must stand for one another in the presence of others."

CONFERENCE BAR—First 12 seats in the two east rows.

RECEPTION COMMITTEE—The Superintendent appointed Rev. J. S. Hankins and Rev. G. W. Abla.

VACANCIES FILLED—The Superintendent appointed Mrs. J. S. Hankins to fill a vacancy in the Auditing Committee.

HOURS OF BUSINESS SITTINGS—8:30 A. M. to 12 noon; 1:30 to 4:30 and 7:00 to 10:00 P. M.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT was heard and accepted with appreciation and commendation. (See reports Section)

REPORT OF ASST. SUPT. was heard and accepted.

RECEPTION COMMITTEE presented Revs. Donald Ault, John Sturk, Roy Bellomy and DeBord, each of whom spoke briefly and were given a seat in the conference bar.

STATISTICAL REPORT was given and received after motion that totals only be read.

AUDITORS' REPORT was given and accepted.

TREASURER'S REPORT given and accepted with gratitude.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT heard and accepted with commendation.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT read as a whole, then Resolution No. 1 was read and accepted with discussion. No. 2 was read and after motion to adopt that portion dealing with individual church assessments was discussed until recessed for dinner.

SECOND BUSINESS SESSION

After prayer, the above discussion was resumed and a substitute resolution offered by Rev. D. E. Snow as follows: "In as much as the word of God, by which we as a church are governed, teaches not only tithing of the individual, but that the Priesthood (which embraces our local churches) also should tithe (Neh. 10. 38 and Num. 18. 28).

"BE IT RESOLVED: That we, as a district, change our method of assessment for budget to the tithe of the gross income of each individual church, more than two years old, except that raised for building purposes; and that any overage be used to help the weaker churches, and be applied to District Missionary Work, or as the District Council may direct."

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that this be offered as a substitute motion. After further discussion a standing vote was taken resulting in 34 for and 14 against. Thus, the substitute motion was before the Conference. After further discussion the "previous question" was called for and a standing vote taken showing 40 for and 5 against, thus bringing the substitute up for vote. A standing vote counted 35 for and 15 against, thereby adopting it.

Resolutions Nos. 3 and 4 were read and adopted.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORTS: Resolutions 1, 2, 3 were adopted and 4, 5 lost.

C. Baynum nominees. J. C. Baynum elected.

Moved and carried we authorize the Council to handle any minor matters of business that we may have overlooked.

Moved and carried that Resolution No. 9 of last year be rescinded, and that the Young People's annual rally be set for the last Saturday of the Camp next year including morning and afternoon services, but not the night service.

Moved and carried we ask our churches to donate quilts or blankets for the camp dormitories. Pledges taken for soliciting subscriptions to our Church Paper resulted in 173.

REPORTS SECTION

TO THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE WEST VIRGINIA DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH:

Dear Co-Laborers with me in Christ, Greetings:

Once again the God of all mercies has permitted us to gather in the capacity of an Annual Conference. The past year has been one of many changes the world over. Changes everywhere—nations rise and fall—today we are the subjects of one government—tomorrow we become the subjects of another. Men shake their heads gravely and say, these are queer times in which we are living. The church has been challenged as never before, but our pastors and churches have accepted the challenge. No one knows the waves of influence that have been put in motion in the various churches of the District that will ripple out over communities and effect thousands of lives in the years to come, eternity alone can reveal the work of the year.

The effect of the war on the churches and Sunday Schools of the District is noticeable, but it has not defeated any church or any Sunday School in the district. In some places the attendance has decreased due to various factors arising out of the war situation, but always this gratifying consciousness is our portion—no matter how many leave, our God is still on hand.

The finances have reached a tide never known before. Pastor's salaries have been increased, but not to the point where the pastor is paid a sum that it is at all in proportion with his services. The Statistician's report will show there has been a net gain of seventy in church membership and a net gain of 207 in Sunday School attendance.

There have been some splendid advances made in the District this year. We have organized two new churches and one mission and also two basement churches have been added, one at Nellis, the other at Terra Alta. Logan and Fayetteville have purchased parsonages. The Mount Hope Church converted part of their Sunday School rooms into a nice five-room parsonage. Huntington paid off their indebtedness and have purchased a nine-room parsonage and have the old parsonage for sale. The Parkersburg church have built a full-size basement with six Sunday School rooms and two rest-rooms. The Charleston church has been raised and is installing a full-size basement for Sunday School rooms. The most of our churches have been taking advantage of the financial situation and have repaired and painted their church property.

I have visited some of the churches five or six times and every church four times; held annual meetings in each church, held one revival, preached 133 times, traveled 14,468 miles. I have received my maximum salary and my traveling expenses are paid to date.

RESOLUTION No. 2a—

In as much as the word of God, by which we as a church are governed; teaches not only tithing of the individual, but that the Priesthood (which embraces our local churches) also should tithe (Neh. 10:38 and Num. 18:28).

BE IT RESOLVED: That we, as a district, change our method of assessment for budget to the tithe of the gross income of each individual church more than two years old, except that raised for building purposes, and that any overage be used to help the weaker churches and be applied to home missionary work, or as the District Council may direct.

RESOLUTION No. 3—

We recommend that the District Superintendent's salary be set at \$1,800.00 per year and traveling expenses at the rate of five cents per mile. That part of salary not provided for in the Budget shall be raised by offerings taken when he visits the churches for quarterly meetings; the half tithe of all preachers of this District actively engaged, and \$8.00 per year from those not actively engaged in the ministry.

RESOLUTION No. 4—

We recommend that each church raise the equivalent of twenty five (25) cents per member for General Conference expenses.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

RESOLUTION No. 1—

Whereas, the Camp meeting Dormitories are insufficient to take care of the people who desire to attend Camp.

And whereas, it is not practical at this time to build another Dormatory.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That we recommend and urge each church financially able, to build a Cottage for their Pastor to be used and known as their Camp Meeting Parsonage. Adopted.

RESOLUTION No. 2—

Whereas, the standard of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has always been against the use of tobacco,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: That "No Smoking" signs be placed conspicuously throughout the Camp Ground. Adopted.

RESOLUTION No. 3—

Inasmuch as the opening of the Lunch Stand detracts from the interest of the alter service,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Lunch Stand remain closed for one half hour after the alter call. Adopted.

RESOLUTION No. 4—

Inasmuch as our churches are already assessed for the expense of the Camp Meeting and members are required to pay their own expense at the Camp Meeting, some feel they are paying twice,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Camp Meeting be put on a free will offering basis and assessments be added to the budget. Lost.

RESOLUTION No. 5—

Inasmuch as this District has around a thousand dollars at hand; also a budget that will bring in around another thousand this year,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the District Conference elect a Home Missionary worker under the direction of the District Council, and that he shall be paid \$100 per month; his moving expense, rent and utilities, and that he in return send all offerings received on said field to the District Treasurer. Lost.
