PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the Annual Assembly of the Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana District convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma, July 27, 1938, at 9:00 A. M. Due to the absence of our beloved General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, Rev. D. R. Close, District Superintendent, presided.

Rev. Paul W. Thomas, General Secretary of Foreign Missions, addressed the Assembly. His message, "Why We Ought to Major Upon the Subject of Holiness," was deeply appreciated and very beneficial to all present.

The roll was called. It was moved and supported to make the first three rows of seats constitute the Assembly Bar.

Brother and Sister Lutz, Brother Brannon, Brother Ray Close and Brother Orval Hofen were introduced and received into the Assembly and granted seats in the Assembly Bar.

It was moved and supported that we write Brother and Sister Ingram a letter of sympathy because they were unable to be with us on account of sickness.

Bro. Ensey, Bro. Osteen, Sister D. R. Close, Sister Orval Hofen and Brother Bottenberg were introduced to the Assembly Bar and granted honorary seats in the Assembly Bar.

It was moved and supported that the time of regular sessions be from 9:00 A. M. to 11:50 A. M. and from 2:00 P. M. to 5:00 P. M.

The Resolutions Committee reported. It was moved and supported to consider each resolution separately.

It was moved and supported we adjourn. Brother Wright dismissed the Assembly with prayer.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session of the Assembly opened at 2:00 P. M. with Rev. Nellie Mix leading the song service. Brother Mac Nelson led in prayer.

Brother Lutz sang a special song after which Brother Thomas addressed the Assembly on the subject "Faithfulness as the Stewards of God."

Mrs. D. R. Close was received into the Assembly.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

The statistical reports were read by Merle Hale, Chairman, and accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee reported and the report was accepted.

Mrs. K. A. Brannon was introduced to the Assembly and voted in as a member of the Assembly.

Rev. W. E. Honeycutt and Rev. H. R. Hale were elected as Ministerial delegates to General Assembly.

Rev. Ray Close was elected first alternate and Rev. K. A. Brannon second alternate.

It was moved and supported to extend time to 5:50 P. M.

Brother Mac Nelson was elected as lay delegate. Brother W. P. Haltom was elected first alternate and Brother Andrew Haltom second alternate.

The Assembly was adjourned with prayer.

THURSDAY, JULY 28, 1938

The third sitting of the Assembly opened Thursday morning with Mrs. Charles Buchanan leading the singing. Brother Kelly led in prayer.

The Minutes were read.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The District Superintendent gave his report.

It was moved and supported to give our District Superintendent a rising vote of thanks for his labors.

It was moved and supported to thank God for His goodness. A wonderful season of prayer followed with the touch of God, shouts of victory and tears of joy.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

The Examining Board reported.

It was moved and supported to give the Hopeton and Pleasant View churches a rising vote of appreciation for their work and kindness.

It was moved and supported to give our dining room committee a rising vote of appreciation for their good work and also to express our appreciation to Sister Wright for her splendid cooking.

It was moved and supported to send our General Superintendent a letter expressing our regret at his absence.

It was moved and supported to have 75 copies of our Minutes printed and more if we can get them at the same price.

It was moved and supported that we have our Minutes printed and enough be supplied for each family of each church and a free will offering be taken to cover the cost.

Brother Nelson expressed the appreciation of the Hopeton and Pleasant View churches for all the preachers and visitors from other churches and visiting communities and gave invitations for all to return.

The Assembly was dismissed with prayer.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that the churches remit to the District Treasurer monthly.
2. If the Examining Board finds no progress made in the Course of Study that the candidate be dropped back one year.
3. We recommend that the fiscal year close July 1st with the pastors changing the following Sunday after camp.
4. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has too much to do at the year ending, let it be resolved that the Treasurer have two weeks before closing his books.
5. We recommend that our District Council arrange a permanent camp date not to conflict with Kansas and Missouri Districts.
6. Be it resolved that each zone arrange a rally quarterly.
7. Be it resolved that an estimate be made by the camp meeting committee of the groceries needed for the camp, and that same be apportioned to each church of the District.
8. Be it resolved that all District checks from the Bank be kept in file to be turned over with Treasurer's books.
9. Be it resolved that each church furnish two bed ticks for the camp.
10. Be it resolved that all church delegates exceed the age of eighteen years.
11. Be it resolved that the Council make arrangements for a monthly bulletin of District interest to be sent to each church.
12. Resolved that each church take an offering and that a committee be appointed by the District Council to buy dining room and kitchen equipment for the District Camp, with the same.
13. We recommend that the following funds; District and Home Missions, be one fund.
14. We recommend that the District Superintendent tith his ministerial income from the District into the District Treasury for Home Missions.
15. Since there has been no provision made for the traveling expense of the Superintendent, other than free will offerings and since the district is so large that it will mean a lot of traveling, be it resolved that a liberal love offering be given him at each quarterly visit to our churches, same to be over and above the amounts ap-

portioned each church. Be it also further resolved that he be paid a minimum of 2½ cents per mile, that the free will offering be applied on the same, and the balance paid from the Home Mission Fund.

16. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the one we have, Be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5 be sent to the district treasurer, and that \$15 for the use of it during the district camp. Also that each Sunday school with an attendance averaging over 75 pay 20 cents per week, and the schools with an attendance under this amount 10 cents per week into the tent fund.

17. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantages of evangelistic meetings, Be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating evangelists and where it is possible and practical they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expenses.

18. Inasmuch as there are such great blessings derived from a ministerial and Christian Workers' Convention, Be it resolved that during the year we have a three-day Convention in the District. The Council shall be the Committee to set the time and place and prepare the program.

19. Resolved that the District be divided into zones. Each zone will have the privilege of conducting spiritual zone meetings quarterly. If possible the District Superintendent will preside or appoint some one to fill his place.

The District was divided into two zones with the following churches in the North Oklahoma zone: Hopeton, Pleasant View, Sand Creek, and Newkirk, Guthrie, Tulsa, Tryon, Fairview. The Texas zone includes the Mayfield, Shamrock, Plainview and Hillsboro churches.

REPORTS

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

The past year has been one of gracious blessings. We appreciate God's presence and leadership. His oversight must be had if we carry on a burdened, unctionized ministry.

We appreciate our people on the Oklahoma-Texas-Louisiana District. We have found it easy to work with every one. A splendid spirit of grace prevails in our midst. To God we give all the credit. Our objective must ever be the complete salvation of souls. Many of our church problems will be settled permanently if we get our seekers through to definite victory.

The General Board in the March meeting joined Louisiana to our District. We have in this addition a splendid group of people.

The past year has been one of advancement in our field. Revivals have been held in all our churches. New fields have become ours through possession. Three regularly organized churches have been added to our ranks, nameiy, Fairview, Tryon and Tulsa. We are waiting to get a building before we completely organize Guthrie. These new churches represent a membership gain of 66.

Our membership last year was 266; Our present membership is 519 in Oklahoma and Texas. This represents a 20 per cent gain or 54 members. The addition of Louisiana brings 73 members which makes a total of 392 members for this district.

The past year we have traveled 9,230 miles in our district work. We have attended two General Board meetings and two school Board meetings. We have received from the District for travel expenses \$141.79 and from Superintendent's offerings \$62.89, which has been applied on travel expense, a total of \$204.68. We have received from the district for salary \$395.00 and from the General Church \$450.00, a total of \$845.00.

We have preached 238 times, held 10 revivals, received 34 members into the Church and organized three churches.

We deeply appreciated the presence and leadership of God as we have gone over the District. Our labors have been lightened as we have fellowshiped our sacrificing Pilgrims who are laboring for the upbuilding of the Kingdom.

We look into next year with the future as bright as the promises of God.
