PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the Annual Assembly of the Oklahoma-Texas-Louisiana District convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma, July 18, 1939, at 9:00 A. M. W. L. Surbrook, our beloved General Superintendent, presiding.

The session opened with song and prayer. Then it was our gracious privilege to have our General Superintendent bring a soul-stirring message to the ministers and workers of the district on the subject, "One's Divine Call," as to life, loyalty and leadership.

Brother Roy Davis of Hillsboro, Texas, was appointed Secretary pro tem in Bro. Burton's absence on account of a funeral.

The roll was called.

The Blackwell church was welcomed into the assembly. A word of appreciation was given for Miss Cork's assistance. It was moved and supported to make the first three seats constitute the assembly bar.

It was moved and supported that the regular sessions be from 9:00 to 11:45 A. M., and 1:30 to 5:00 P. M.

It was moved and supported to recess.

Special prayer was requested for Mrs. Henry Hofen, Brother Honeycutt's daughter, and a request from Bethany, Oklahoma. A gracious season of prayer followed with God's presence near.

The afternoon session opened with a song led by Brother Davis. Prayer followed.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

The following were introduced into the assembly bar. Bro. Zeits, Miss Florabelle Siater, Miss Gick, Miss Lois Cork, Mrs. R. W. Wolfe and Bro. Bess, and were given honorary seats in the assembly bar.

The pastors reported from the different churches as to the spiritual, financial and numerical gain or loss.

A letter from H. R. Hale was read to the assembly, of his labors, at Lucas, Kansas, and his desire to be with us, and same wa appreciated by all.

It wa moved and supported to recess until 5:30 P. M.

Session again opened with song, and prayer by Sister Nelson and Brother Close.

The Bilbe sisters from Blackwell sang a special number.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

It was moved and supported to refer apportionment of the Foreign Missionary budget to the Ways and Means Committee.

Bro. and Sister Berkebile were introduced to the Assembly Bar.

It was moved and supported to extend time 20 minutes.

It was moved and supported to give our General Superintendent a rising vote of appreciation for his presence with us and his labors of love.

It was moved and supported to adjourn.

The fourth session opened Wednesday morning at 9:00 A. M.

Sister Nelson led us in song. A gracious season of prayer followed, led by Sr. Gick.

Bro. Wolfe led the devotional service, reading and exhorting from I Thess. 1.

It was moved and supported to dispense with the roll call.

The minutes were read.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

The Examining Board reported.

It was moved and supported to recess until call of the Chair.

The fifth session opened with a special song by Bro. and Sr. Whittington.

The District Superintendent reported and same was accepted.
 The Auditing Committee reported.

We, the Ways and Means Committee, recommend that the District Treasurer be furnished with a large double entry ledger.

The sixth session opened with Sr. Brannon playing and Sr. Burton leading in song.

The Statistical Committee reported.

The Treasurer reported and same was accepted.

The last session adjourned.

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STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. We recommend that the churches remit to the District Treasurer monthly.

2. We recommend that the fiscal year close July 1st with the pastors changing the following Sunday after camp.

3. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the year ending, be it resolved that the Treasurer have two weeks before closing his books.

4. Be it resolved that an estimate be made by the camp meeting committee of the groceries needed for the camp, and that same be apportioned to each church of the District.

5. Be it resolved that all church delegates exceed the age of eighteen years.

6. Be it resolved that the Council make arrangements for a monthly bulletin of District interest be sent to each church.

7. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the ones we have, be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5.00 be sent to the district treasurer, and that \$15.00 be paid for the use of it during the district camp; also that each Sunday School with an attendance over 75 pay 20c per week and the school with an attendance under this number pay 10c per week into the tent fund.

8. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantage of evangelistic meetings, be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating evangelists and where it is possible and practical they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expenses.

9. Inasmuch as there are such great blessings derived from a ministerial and Christian Workers' Convention, be it resolved that during the year we have a 3-day Convention in the District. The Council shall be the Committee to set the time and place and to prepare the program.

10. Resolved that the District be divided into zones. Each zone will have the privilege of conducting spiritual zone meetings quarterly. If possible the District Superintendent will preside or appoint someone to fill his place.

The District was divided into two zones with the following churches in the Northern Oklahama zone: Hopeton, Pleasant View, Sand Creek, Newkirk, Tulsa, Tryon and Fairview. The Texas zone includes the Shamrock, Plainview and Hillsboro churches.

REPORTS

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that Resolution No. 2 of last minutes be dropped, since it is fully covered in the Manual, P. 98, Sec. 142.
2. We recommend that we as a District put on a subscription drive for the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, during the entire month of August.
3. We recommend that each local church promote a Home Missionary campaign by holding revivals in nearby communities and establishing a preaching point and Sunday School wherever possible.
4. We recommend that the District have 150 copies of the Assembly Minutes printed for distribution, the same to be sold for 10¢ each to help defray printing expenses.
5. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint all committees for the next year during the present assembly sitting.

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RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid \$480.00 for his services this year.
2. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid 2½ cents per mile for traveling expense, the same to be accredited to that church's District Budget.
4. Since the Manual provides that each district shall furnish the superintendent with a parsonage, we recommend that the district set aside \$150.00 rent for the District Superintendent to have a parsonage.
5. We recommend that the District Budget be set at \$1800.00.
6. We recommend that the Department of Foreign Missions be allowed to raise its own claim under its own head, at the rate as set by the General Assembly, which is \$380.00 the said \$380.00 shall be apportioned among the churches as follows:

7. We recommend that a District Home Missionary Budget be set at \$300.00 the same to be raised by the Department of General Home Missions as they come in for their claim as set by the General Assembly.
8. We recommend that the pastors and District Superintendent pay their tithes monthly, to the District Treasurer, the same to be applied on the District Budget.
9. We recommend that Administrative funds be raised automatically at 20 per cent of the following Budget as apportioned to the churches.
10. We recommend that the remaining \$520.00 be apportioned among the churches as follows:

11. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$10.00 for his services this year.

12. We recommend that the District postage, stationery, telegrams and telephone calls be paid out of the District Budget.

13. We recommend that District claims and District Home Missions be kept in separate funds.

14. We recommend that in case there is not enough money comes in through District claims and ministerial tithes to take care of the District Superintendent's support that the rest be taken from the District Home Missionary fund.

15. We recommend that the District Treasurer be furnished with a triplicate receipt book, that the original receipt be sent to the remitter, the second to be sent to the District Superintendent, the third to be kept by the District Treasurer.

16. We recommend that all District and General funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.

17. Be it resolved that all District checks from the bank be kept on file to be turned over with Treasurer's books (from last minutes).

REPORT OF EXAMINING COMMITTEE

We recommend the following for continuation of First Year License: Chester Whittington, Merie H. Hale and Mrs. Roy Davis; for Second Year License, Auburn Whittington; for Third Year License, Bobby Wilson; F. S. Berkbile passed the Board which makes him a member of this Assembly.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We are one year nearer eternity than we were at our camp meeting last year. What has been done in the service of the Lord will stand or fall on its own merits. What has been left undone will never be done. We go on to the work of the present and not the past. The work of the church is a spiritual work and one that is looked upon by the Lord as of first importance. If He looks upon it in that light, well may we direct our energies to those things which are first.

This past year has been one of battles and victories with the precious blood of Jesus cleansing just now. All our churches have had revivals. A number of them have been fruitful. This spring all our tents have been busy. The following meetings have been held:

Fairview held a tent meeting with Bro. H. R. Hale as evangelist. This was the best meeting since organizing the class. Newkirk enjoyed a good meeting with Bro. Bowman as evangelist. Bro. Honeycutt started a tent meeting in Shamrock, but after several attempts to keep the tent up he was forced to go to a church building which the Presbyterians let us have. Wife and I and Lois Cork held a tent campaign of six weeks' duration, in Blackwell Oklahoma, in which over 50 individual seekers sought the Lord. We received 18 members and there are more to come yet. We are staying to pastor the work here. As we pen these lines, Brother Brannon is in a tent meeting in Tulsa, with good interest. Brother Davis is in a meeting at Prairie Point, out of Hillsboro. Neither of these men can get away for the first part of camp because the meeting was at such a point that to leave means to lose the ground gained.

A word of appreciation is due our pastors who have so nobly stood by and prayed and labored at their respective fields for the salvation of men. We appreciate our workers on this field and may God multiply them so this country can be taken for God and souls.

We have held 35 business meeting. We have held 7 revival on the district and 2 off the district, as the general church allows the home missionary superintendents four. We have preached 209 times, 292 have sought regeneration and 75 sanctification. We have received 32 members and one church ready for organization.

We have traveled 11,935 miles in district work and received \$273.48. \$63.47 of this has been in Superintendent's offerings and \$15.00 from Brother Wolfe, which was applied on traveling expenses. Both the \$63.47 and the \$15.00 is counted in the \$273.48.

At the close of our camp last year, I did deputation work at the request of the general church, and travelled 1900 miles and 1174 from the general assembly back to the district. We have attended two regular Bible School Meetings and one called meeting, a total of 2310 miles.

We have received in salary from the District \$480.00 and from the general church \$480.00. We have tithed into the District Treasury. We have received for stationery \$28.50.

The general church gave to this district \$75.00 for Home Missionary work. This money was used in the Blackwell meeting.

Last year due to an oversight, we forgot to mention the love offering for our car of \$143.00. We appreciated this, as it made it possible to have a car to travel the district. This amount shows on our Treasurer's books. We turned back a tithe of this into the District.

The past year, nearly all our churches have made improvements which have added much to our property and to its valuation. Pleasant View put in electric lights, which cost approximately \$125.00. Sand Creek had good fortune to have the School Board put in electric lights for them. Newkirk painted their parsonage which cost \$25.00. Fairview built a parsonage by putting in rooms in the back, which came to \$30.00. Hopeton did some general improving, shingling, etc., at \$50.00. Bogalusa improved their church to the amount of \$150.00. Baton Rouge did some valuable improving at \$100.00. Hillsboro improved their property to the extent of \$25.00. Improvements in the District amounted to \$535.00.

We have appreciated working with our Pilgrims on the Oklahoma-Texas-Louisiana field. We trust and pray that we will continue to keep the burden of a lost world upon us.
